## THE BUILDING AND ORGAN

The very unusual free-form concrete church edifice is the first stage of a master plan developed by Pratt, Box, and Henderson, Architects, of Dallas, and has received wide acclaim.

The Sipe-Yarbrough Mechanical Action Organ was given to St. Stephen Church by Mrs. Eugene McElvaney in memory of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. King. The specification of the instrument is as follows:
