

Keith Shafer

A native of Connecticut, Keith Shafer was educated at the Hartt College of Music at the University of Hartford; the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati; and the Meadows School of the Arts at Southern Methodist University, where he studied organ with Richard Fowler, John Holtz, and the renowned concert artists Gerre Hancock, and Robert Anderson. A finalist in all of the major American organ playing competitions, Mr. Shafer has appeared in concert throughout the country. Since 1983, he has been Director of Music and Organist of historic St. Paul's Church in Augusta, Georgia, where the music program is recognized as one of the most innovative in the Episcopal Church, with thousands of music-lovers attending the acclaimed concert series, Tuesday's Music Live and The Riverwalk Series. Mr. Shafer has spent residencies in a number of British cathedrals, including Worcester, York Minster, St. Mary's Cathedral (Edinburgh), and St. Paul's Cathedral, London. The St. Paul's Choir has sung services at the cathedrals in Salisbury, Wells, Durham, and York Minster and will make their third European tour in 1999 with appearances in London, and Canterbury. Mr. Shafer has served as Georgia Convenor of the American Guild of Organists, as Dean and Treasurer of the Augusta Chapter. He has been a member of the faculty of the Sewanee Church Music Conference held annually at The University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee, begins his fourth term as Director in 1999, and is presently a member of the Conference Board of Trustees. Active as an organ and church music consultant, he is a member of the Liturgical Commission of the Episcopal Diocese of Georgia, and has made a number of recordings and CD's which have been heard throughout the country on National Public Radio's Pipedreams and Georgia Public Radio's Performance Showcase.
