A HISTORY OF EVENTS

An Opening Word

The following chronological history is by no means exhaustive nor complete. It does, however, briefly present how, by God's help, we have arrived at this glorious day of celebration. May these words help us, our children, and one day, our children's children to remember that it is the Triune God we worship. He alone has made it possible for us to build this organ. As this instrument is heard ringing out God's praises over the years, may many come to the Lord Jesus for help and salvation.

HISTORY

If anyone should ask over time: "How did the building of the new organ take place?" we would certainly need to reply without a moment's hesitation: "With the help of the Lord." From time to time over the last fifteen years, there arose interest on the part of organists, choir members and music lovers in the congregation to ask the question: "Is it possible for us to add ranks of pipes or to enhance our present pipe organ?"

The first pipe organ was a 12-rank Moller II Artiste which was built in Hagerstown, Maryland. It was installed in our church and dedicated on June 6, 1971. The Moller II Artiste, though a small organ, provided registrations appropriate for use in our Lutheran, liturgical tradition. The II Artiste was designed by the M.P. Moller Company as a prefabricated instrument, one built at the factory and

then brought to location for installation. II Artiste models were most often installed as "practice organs," and were generally found in colleges or universities where students were learning. The II Artiste was selected for Christ the King because of its stop selection, its affordability, and because it could be constructed in the existing chamber above our choir loft.

While this first pipe organ proved to be a tremendous blessing to the congregation over the years, the instrument was, all in all, too small for the size of the church building. To lead our congregation in our large church nave, organists needed to draw upon practically the entire instrument to lead the congregation in worship and hymnody. Using most of the stops, our organists were limited in their ability to change registrations between hymn verses and at times, limited in providing enough voicing at holidays and festivals when our church would be filled with worshipers. Hence, the organ, played at capacity, had one "sound."

Consequently, inquiries were made as to whether adding pipes was a possibility. In each instance, it seemed that such attempts to add pipes to the Moller II Artiste came to naught for one of two reasons. First, there was no more room in the existing organ chamber above the choir loft. The II Artiste was literally "crammed" in the small chamber. Secondly, there always was the matter of funding such a project.

In late 1992, both an unexpected problem and an unexpected blessing from God opened a door of opportunity for the congregation. After tuning our Moller pipe organ for our celebration of Christmas in December of 1992, we were informed by our tuner/repairman that soldered pipes, located far to the rear of the organ chest, were beginning to lean and fall. Evidently, atmospheric conditions prompted the solder to weaken and the pipes to fall. Soon we were told, we would lose an entire division of pipes. Coupled with this, the Moller II Artiste, "crammed" tightly in the existing chamber, made it impossible for the tuner-repairman to tune all of the pipes without first emptying the organ of all pipes to the front of the chest. So it was that falling pipes, the inability of the repairman to tune part of the organ and the potential for needing the organ "releathered" after nearly 25 years of service prompted some serious thinking about what we should do.

The Christian believer is constantly amazed at how the Lord **always** provides what is needed at the precise time. Such is the

case with our new organ. With a new problem came a gift from God. In December of 1992, our congregation was blessed to receive a substantial sum of money as a thankoffering from one of our families. The gift came with the request that the Pastors would provide several options as to how this gift might be utilized. Knowing that something would need to be done about the organ, the Pastors proposed as one of their suggestions, that the money be used to repair or enhance our present organ, or be used to begin a fund to build a new instrument. With the approval of the Elders and Trustees, the Pastors were given the responsibility of selecting a committee to begin studying this issue, and to bring a recommendation to the vestry as soon as possible.

The first organ committee consisted of 13 members and convened for the first time January 9, 1994. These faithful people began the arduous task of studying the situation, assessing needs, and consulting experts and builders. The first question that needed to be studied was whether or not the Moller II Artiste could or should be repaired, or whether a new instrument should be considered. What would display proper stewardship of our blessings? It was a difficult task! From the initial meeting it was the request of the Pastors that given the size of the committee, the various experience of the members and the potential for such a study to be subjective in nature, that come decision-making time, if there was not unanimous agreement, committee members would agree that the majority opinion would, by vote, be made unanimous so that one, solid recommendation might be brought to the congregation.

Let it go on record to indicate that countless, untold hours of work and study were performed by members of the committee. We must forever thank God for the work and dedication of each member. After much study and consultation with experts in the field, the committee came to the conclusion that the space restrictions and limitations of the present organ and its console would make addition or enhancement of the Moller II Artiste undesirable and problematic. It was the opinion of the committee to look toward the acquisition of a new instrument.

It was at this point that committee work became even more intense. The names and companies of reputable organ builders were secured. Requests for proposals and estimates were made. While proposals were coming in and being studied, members began to travel to visit installation sights of various pipe organs and digital electronic instruments. In this whole process, it was important that

committee members would not "get ahead" of one another in the learning process, that they would respect each other's opinion and properly communicate information and feelings in a Christ-like manner. This was a long and difficult process and the work demanded much of committee members and our leaders. There were differences of opinion. Sometimes misunderstandings arose which needed the attention of the Pastors and Elders. Still, with the help of the LORD, the work continued.

Eventually, the organ committee came to make two decisions which would chart a course for the congregation. First, it was decided by the majority that the sound of a pipe organ was preferred to the sound of an electronic instrument which produces its sound digitally. Next, the committee had the task of deciding what kind of a pipe organ it would select and recommend to the congregation. Electro-pneumatic action, slider action and tracker action instruments were all considered. Suffice it to say that after much work, the committee decided to recommend the purchase of a tracker-action organ by builder Karl Wilhelm of Quebec, Canada at a cost of \$259,850.00. Though this decision was not the choice of all members on the organ committee, the committee by majority vote made unanimous decided to recommend that a Wilhelm Organ be built at Christ The King. This recommendation was presented and approved by the congregation on Sunday, May 22, 1994. As a condition, the congregation stipulated that a contract could not be signed nor work be started until 60% of all funds were raised.

This action, taken by our Voter's Assembly, set into play many events. Fundraising plans and activities were mapped out. The organ committee enlarged as "honorary members" were added. Intense publicity work began. A sense of joy and anticipation filled many people and with God's blessing, generous gifts were received for this project.

While the congregation had decided to move ahead with the building of the Wilhelm tracker organ and while the committee continued to work diligently, concerns were increasingly being voiced about the placement of the tracker organ in our balcony and difficulties which could ensue as our organist/director would lead the choir. Furthermore, some began to question the choice of a tracker instrument in terms of its compatibility with our choir, namely, whether or not its registration was subtle enough for soloists and a smaller choir such as ours. Also, would organists with a more moderate degree of ability be able to handle the instrument adequately, given

the location of its drawstops and its distinctive keyboard touch? With these concerns verbalized over and over and with personal relationships growing strained, the Pastor, in consultation with the Board of Elders, determined that a Task Force be established to evaluate the criteria upon which the selection of a tracker organ had been made.

In the Spring of 1995, the congregation heard the report of the Task Force, which was comprised of 6 individuals. This Study Committee determined that while the Organ Committee had made its findings after much study and in good faith, the decision was based primarily on the criteria of craftsmanship, anticipated longevity and compatibility with congregational singing. It was believed that matters of logistics in the balcony and compatibility with our choir was not adequately addressed. Consequently, the Congregation rescinded its motion to build the tracker organ on May 14, 1995. Secondly, the congregation resolved to thank the Organ Committee for its 18 months of study and assistance to the Task Force.

Would an organ be built at Christ The King? Yes, with the help of the Lord! As the Task Force was completing its findings, an opportunity was presented to Christ The King to purchase a 3 manual, 44-rank Moller Pipe Organ from Queens College in Charlotte, N.C. With the congregation interested in learning more about this organ, our Organist, Mr. Bruce Sininger and Vice President of the Congregation Walter Geffert were sent to Charlotte to inspect the instrument with representatives of the Holloway Organ Company of Carmel, Indiana, brokers for the instrument. Mr. Sininger and Mr. Geffert also met with Mr. Benjamin Williams, Builder, at the Knowlton Organ Company in Davidson, N.C. At a special Voter's Meeting held Wednesday, May 10, 1995, the congregation gathered to hear information about this opportunity. On Sunday, May 14, 1995, Christ The King Lutheran Congregation voted by strong majority (95 to 22) to purchase the Moller electro-pneumatic action organ.

The organ was purchased from the Holloway Organ Company at a cost of \$ 195,000.00. It was removed from Queen's College, its home of 30 plus years, and transported to the Knowlton Organ Company, where the work of rebuilding and reconfiguring the instrument began for specific installation at Christ the King. The acquisition of such a large and expensive instrument was no easy task, and required countless hours of time and precise attention by congregational leaders. Special public thanks needs to be given to Irving M. Stahl, Esq., Attorney at Law, Southfield, MI., for his careful

assistance in helping our congregation make this purchase.

Our Moller II Artiste rang out the praises of God for the last time on Sunday, April 7, 1996. The next day, April 8th, Mr. Benjamin Williams and workers from Knowlton Organ arrived and began to dismantle our old organ. The new, 44-rank Moller Pipe Organ arrived early Tuesday morning, April 9th. Piece by piece, pipe by pipe the new organ was brought into the church hallways, choir room and nave. The largest and heaviest parts of the organ were hoisted into the balcony. Within days, the new organ was taking shape in our balcony. By Saturday, April 13th, the facade pipes were already in place. On Friday and Saturday April 19th and 20th, workers were calling for members to assist them in the formation of a "pipe brigade" to pass all 2,549 pipes to workers for installation. While the organ was being built and tuned, the congregation worshipped and sang with the help of the Yamaha Grand Piano which was acquired in the spring of 1996. The organ was first heard by our congregation on Sunday, May 5th, 1996. It was utilized for an entire worship service for the first time on Sunday, May 12, 1996.

This morning we dedicate our new pipe organ to the glory of God and to the welfare of His holy people. Let us never forget that we can make many plans, but only God can bring our plans to fruition.

All that we have accomplished together has been possible only because He is our Helper and our Savior. On this wonderful day, let each of us pledge that remembering these events, we will continue to look to Him for all things, spiritual and temporal. Though we can not thank everyone individually who worked and sacrificed to make this dream a reality, we take time to thank God and all people who have been involved in this loving work. Let us remember with joy what we have accomplished together in this time and place with the help of the LORD!

BRUCE SININGER, music director at Christ the King Lutheran Church Grosse Pointe Woods, has established a very successful performing and teaching career. He has performed solo recitals throughout the United States on piano and organ, and has sung operatic roles with such companies as the Rochester N.Y. Lyric Opera, Cincinnati Opera and the Nashville Opera Company. He has also appeared with many major

symphony orchestras throughout the United States in vocal oratorio work.

Bruce has had the privilege to work under such great artists as Italo Tajo, of the famed La Scala Opera in Italy, conductors James Conlin, Chuck Mangione, and Pinchas Zukerman. He also studied privately with such artists as:

In New York, Bruce premiered a musical written by Charles Strouse, the composer of such shows as "Bye Bye Birdie" and "Annie". He also has an active musical theatre career in which he has had the leads in "Guys and Dolls", "Brigadoon", "Sweeney Todd", "South Pacific" and "Pirates of Penzance". Bruce was also privileged to sing for and be coached by Aaron Copland in his song cycle "Old American Songs".

Bruce studied voice, piano and organ at the famed Eastman School of Music in New York and did his graduate and post-graduate work at the Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati, where he was also a Teaching Assistant in piano accompaniment. He is currently professor of piano, voice and theory at Wayne State University, and at The Center for Creative Studies Institute of Music and Dance.

KNOWLTON ORGAN COMPANY

Upon hearing that the fine pipe organ in Queen's College Auditorium was up for sale, my initial reaction was a curious mixture of astonishment and loss. How could any institution reasonably consider parting with a pipe organ as nice as this one? As a resident of Charlotte for 20 years, this organ was well known to me as being one of the tonally richest and most complete organs in our city, safely tucked away in a beautiful, staid, academic environment. It was, however, a fine musical gem rarely available for public admiration, and heard only at graduation and convocation services, for the sole benefit of students, family and faculty of the college. Upon reflection, we realized that any fine organ deserves to be used and enjoyed by many, especially in serving a higher calling and, in this case, one institution's loss serves as another's gain.

There could scarcely be a finer or more spiritual new home for this organ than Christ the King Lutheran Church, and we at Knowlton Organ Company are proud to have been chosen to bring this organ to its new home. Our challenge was to completely transform this organ - which had formerly been installed entirely in chambers, designed never to be seen by its audience - into a functional and integral visual component of the church sanctuary, entirely "at home" in its new surroundings.

Without having the architectural flexibility inherent in designing a brand-new organ from scratch, a tremendously improbable number of engineering factors had to mesh completely for this organ to be redesigned and rebuilt successfully for any new home. As the complex engineering and visual design came together, and the many seemingly insurmountable obstacles were overcome, it became apparent that there could be no more appropriate home for this fine organ.

Then, finally the moment we heard the first real notes of music played on the organ in the sanctuary, our goals for this organ were realized and surpassed - we had finally succeeded in bringing the richness and splendor of this organ to Christ the King for all to enjoy. My sincere thanks go to each member of the organ committee and the congregation's representatives, without whose determination, faith and very hard work, this project could not have come to fruition.
