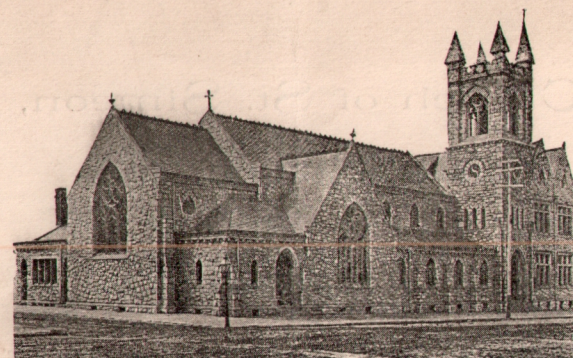

Another cause of great joy to every loyal member of the Church of St. Simeon is the fact that the large Pipe Organ will be ready to be used on the day of the Consecration.

The number of those who have been unable to make their offering to the Organ Fund regularly is so small, comparatively, that we feel sure that the amounts will all be paid in, or provided for.

It has been thought wise by the Vestry and others to give an opportunity for all members of the Parish to hear the Organ at its best, and in a way that it could rarely be heard in a regular service. Accordingly I am happy to say that Mr. D. D. WOOD, the eminent blind organist of St. Stephen's Church, has very kindly consented to "Open" the Organ, assisted by Mr. Lawson and the Choir of the Church, on WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 25th, at 8 P. M.

It is necessary to ask for an offering of 25 cents, which will be received at the door.

The following scheme will give an idea of the Organ:
