RARE CHURCH RITE

German Catholics at Little Town of Petersburg Greatly Honored-Unusual Ceremony of Consecration for Their New Church Edifice.

Manchester, Ia., Oct. 24.-Three hundred Catholic priests and many dignitaries of the church are in attendance at the consecration of the new German Catholic church at Petersburg today. It is rare that the ceremony of consecration is performed and few churches in the state have been thus honored.

The services began at 7 a. m. and continued until after noon. Bishop Shinner of Superior, Wis., performed the act of consecration and Archbishor Keane preached the sermon.

Besides the large number of priests and other church dignitaries in attendance are many Catholics from all parts of the state, and the occasion is notable, marking a new achievement in Catholic circles in the state. In order that a church may enjoy


