

HENRY G. THUNDER TO PLAY AT GRACE

**Noted Philadelphia Organist
Fourth Recitalist of
Lenten Series.**

Henry G. Thunder, the noted Philadelphia organist will be the recitalist at the fourth of Grace M. E. Church's series of Lenten organ recitals, to be given tomorrow evening. Mr. Thunder will play the following program:

MR. THUNDER'S CAREER.

Mr. Thunder was conductor for 18 years of the Choral Society of Philadelphia the largest singing society in the city, composed of 350 mixed voices, giving oratorios and large choral works with orchestra and soloists. He was conductor for four years of the Fortnightly Club of Philadelphia, composed of 80 male voices, the largest and most distinguished male chorus in Philadelphia. He was associate choral conductor of the Philadelphia Orchestra for the production of Mahler's eighth symphony, given with extraordinary success for the first time in America on March 2, 1916.

Mr. Thunder combined his two societies and prepared one wing of the great chorus of 1,000 voices that created such a sensation at the performances just given that six additional performances have been sold out. The Philadelphia Orchestra Association presented Mr. Thunder with a loving cup in recognition of his work in the preparation of this colossal work.

Frank H. Mason, bass soloist of Grace Church, will be the soloist.
