Improvements in Clinton Avenue Reformed Church.

The chancel end of the Clinton Avenue Reformed Church has undergone some radical alterations during the last few weeks. A new rejedos, choir loft and pulpit platform have been constructed.

pulpit platform have been constructed. and these changes greally enhance the appearance of the interior of the edifice.

The improvements are for the purpose of accommodating a choir. When the church was built many of the charter members and lorgest contributors were opposed to anything except congregotional singing led by a precentor. No provision was made for a choir, and the organ consol was down on the level with the congregation, while the pulpit was perched hack behind the organist and the precentor's pintform.

The present alterations reverse this order of things, the minister being brought down to a closer level with the congregation and in front of the organ consol and choir. The quartet choir of the church consisting of Dr. H. J. F. Walhauser, basso; John F. Thomas, tenor; Miss Grace Whitmere Sins, seprane, and Mrs. Irme Konkle, contraite, will take part in all the Sunday services hereafter, and in addition to the quartet the seventy members of the choral society, organised from among the members of the church by Organist William E. Ashmoll, have

planned to render an oratorio one Sun-

day evening during each month.

new choir loft is hirzer than it looks from the body of the church, and will accom-

modata the enlire number of extra sins-

cra. but, if necessary, the ands of the gallery adjoining the chair loft can be used to seat a few of them.
The general character of the woodwork comprising the changes, comports with

the rest of the church in carving and general architecture. The material used is choice black wainut and fancy oak. The pulpit, which has been in use since the early days of the church, is a hand-some piece of work, costing originally over \$400. It is composed of precious woods, finely carved, and bears this in-

The entire reredon will be unveiled and used at the church services to-morrow. A new organ is in process of construction, and this will be ready for use in the course of a few more Sundays.
