Dear Sir:

For some time we have been negotiating with Mr. D. A. Flentrop of Zaandam, Holland to build us an organ.

This summer Mr. Flentrop was in the States and visited our campus. While here he advised that you had one of his organs on your floor, which had apparently been there for some time and you might be interested in disposing of it at a bargain price to a University.

It is our understanding that this organ has twelve stops, but no pipes or reeds. We are interested because it will take him threeyears to build the organ for us, which was to be eight stops. Then there is the complication of a firm price from Mr. Flentrop to us, because he must provide in his contract for any increases in wages during the three year period of construction.

We do not know whether or not we could finance the organ which you have, but we would appreciate your giving us a firm price, also the exact specifications.

Although the price of \$15,000 is no doubt a bargain we had hoped that the price would not be in excess of \$12,00, which is a little more than the Music Department has in their budget for the purchase of an organ, and unless we can stay within this figure, we will probably have contract with Mr. Flentrop for a smaller organ.

If by any chance you would be interested in the \$12,000 figure we would want to send one of our music professors to your factory for a careful examination of the voicing.

Dear Mr. Bolton:

We acknowledge and thank you for your letter of October 9th regarding the Flentrop organ we have here in our factory.

We note that you feel you cannot spend in excess of \$12,000 and it would be just impossible for us to furnish this instrument at that price. The original price we had on this organ was \$17,500 which was reduced to \$15,000 so that we could dispose of it but at this figure we just about break even.

We note that you state you will no doubt contact Mr. Flentrop for a smaller organ, but we doubt whether you could get what you desire for the figure you mention since we know what we have done to the price on the organ we have here.

Quite naturally we sincerely hope we will have the privilege of furnishing this organ for you and, if it would be of any assistance, we could finance half of the price of the organ over a period of two years covered by equal semi-annual notes bearing 6% interest.

We sincerely hope we will hear from you further regarding the possibility and feel that we should inform you that there are two or three other colleges extremely interested in the instrument.
