**NEW ORGAN.**—The large and handsome new organ recently purchased in Boston for Christ Church arrived here to day and will at once be put up in place of the old one, which for so long a time has occupied a place in that venerable edifice and has furnished the musical accompaniment to the voices of several generations who have worshiped therein. The new organ, which is said to be a fine instrument, cost about \$1600, which sum has almost been raised by voluntary subscriptions and through the exertions of the Ladies' Sewing and other societies of that church.

**THE NEW CHRIST CHURCH ORGAN.**—The new organ at Christ Church, built by Hook & Hastings, of Boston, was used in the service yesterday for the first time. The instrument is a very fine one and fully up to the high standard of work for which the above company is noted. Its strength consists of five sets of pipes in the swell controlled by the upper manual and five sets of open pipes for the lower manual with two octaves of 16 ft Bonodon pipes, pedal bass, 595 pipes in all, which, in the "grand organ," gives a fine effect. Among the solo stops the flute and hautboy in the swell, and the dulciana in the open stops, are remarkable for their voicing and quality. The organ is built with all the latest improvements of mechanical registers and auxiliaries, and under the able management of Prof. R. E. Heyman, will discourse some fine music. The old instrument which has been moved temporarily to the lecture room, was built by Pomlitz, of Baltimore, in 1840. After 45 years of service it still possesses a sweet tone and considerable power.
