Gentlemen:-

We are still very happy over our organ. It is as beautiful in tone, if not more beautiful, as any other pipe organ in Cloquet.

However, there is one thing that is not quite satisfactory: its action is quite slow. I believe I mentioned this fact to Mr. Frey, your representative in Minneapolis, quite some time ago. But he seemed to suggest nothing about it.

Now what can you do about the action? We just don't imagine it is slow. One of the leading organists in this part of the country says it is very slow. And our own church organist complains. And I have tried it too. It is very annoying to press on the keys and get no response right away.

Please do something about it before the 15th inst., when the final payment is due. If you cannot attend to it before that time, please advise us as to what you can and are going to do.

May I ask you how to get in touch with your organ tuners, and what you charge for tuning? We shall, however, have to engage someone at once --- this week, as a matter of fact. So we do not expect any of your men to tune it this time. A Mr. Olson of Duluth will have to do it for us. You don't happen to know anything about this man, do you? Of course not, if he has never been with you people.

But it is the action that we want you to take care of at earliest convenience.
