Valuable. Church Organ.—The authorities of the Catbolic Church of Harrisburg. Pa., have just had completed for them, at the establishment of Mr. Henry Berger, a very handsome organ, the case of which is 12 fort high, 10 feet wide and 6 fost in depth. It is of oak, in the Gothic style of archilecture, and, apart from the music it is sus-epible 4, may be regarded as quite ornamental. The case contains a single row of keys, with ten stoys, including a pleasing and useful writely of wind instruments, which, with the sid of a pelal organ, are capable of supplying a volume of sweet sounds equal to the voices of a congregation --indeed the instrument may heregarded as a congregationd organ in power, and was designed as such by the pastor of the church, Rev.
