SACRED CONCERT.—The Choir of St. Patrick's Catholic Church, of this borough, gave a sacred concert in their church, on Thursday evening last. The attendance was very respectable, and would no doubt have been much larger, had the concert been properly advertised. Notices appeared in the papers, and no larger bills than the programmes were printed—so that many persons who might otherwise have attended, were entirely ignorant that the concert was to take place. The meeting of the Teacher's Association, at Washington Hall, likewise prevented many from attending. The music on this occasion was well selected and was rendered in a manner that seemed to give great satisfaction to the audience. The concert, like the one last summer, was given to assist in paying for the new organ recently built for the church at Berger's Organ Manufactory, in this borough. This instrument has, within the past few weeks, been erected on the choir of the church, and, as will be seen by a card attached to Mrs. Berger's advertisement, gives perfect satisfaction to the committee. It is certainly a powerful and fine-toned instrument and reflects great credit on the builder, Mr. Berger. We can assure the congregation, if they need more funds and see proper to give another concert, that their Choir's delightful music cannot fail to procure a full attendance of our citizens..
