pastor, Rev. Edward Haines Kistler, A. M. The soloists, Dr. Kistler, Miss

rad, acquitted themselves with great
credit. The organ responded magnifi-
cently to every touch from the pas-
sages where volume was required to the exquisite solo effects. The great
and swell organs have 61 pipes and the
pedal 30 pipes, with a total of 975 pipes and 30 stops, with 17 speaking stops.
Its weight is 11,735 pounds.
In accordance with a resolution pass-
ed at the last annual meeting of this
congregation, an Organ Committee, consisting of Dr. A. L. Kistler, chair-
man; Jacob H. Burger, L. H. Mertz,
Charles A. Bear and Chas. W. Laros
was authorized to select and purchase
an organ after providing funds. After
a brief correspondence, Andrew Carne- gie generously agreed to donate half
the cost of a \$3000 organ, provided the
congregation contributed the other half, and install it. Sunday morning,
May 5, witnessed the successful en-
deavor to meet this offer, and this fine,
new Bates and Culley organ is the re-
sult. The thanks of the congregation and its friends are heartily extended
to Dr. Carnegie for making such a mu-
sical success possible.
