CONTRACT

We hereby agree to furnish an Acolian Pipe Organ, of the foregoing general specifications and details of construction, of the highest attainable standard in workmenship and material, and to erect same in the residence of Mr. Robert T. Lincoln, at Manchester, Vermont, on or before November 1st, 1908, for, and in consideration of the sum of Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$11,500) payable upon completion of the Organ in position.

It is understood that the Orchestrelle now in Mr. Lincoln's residence. is to be taken in part payment, and to be considered as a credit of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to be deducted from said \$11,500.

Organ to be at purchasers risk on and after arrival on his premises.

GENERAL DETAILS OF CONSTRUCTION.

- (a) LOCATION. Organ to be built in two divisions, to be located on stair landing in main hall, with one division at each side of the window.
- (b) ORGAN CONSOLE. An organ console, containing two manual and pedal claviers, also Solo tracker bar and all mechanical devices for control of the organ when playing it by means of the roll, to be placed in the first floor hall at foot of stairway, or whatever location may seem more desirable.
- (c) <u>BLOWING PLANT</u>. Blowing plant to be located in basement in room provided for that purpose. Builder to provide an efficient electrical blowing apparatus to furnish the necessary wind supply. An independent motor generator to be furnished by builder to furnish proper low voltage for organ mechanism.
- (d) CASE WORK. Case work for main organ and console is not included in this proposition.
