

THE DANFORTH CHAPEL

The Chapel is merged with the Jessie Preston Draper Memorial, as a symbol of the centrality of religion in education. Every student who enters the academic building will see the doors opening into the Chapel. The architects of the Chapel, Jamieson and Spearl, of St. Louis, have performed their task with skill and reverence; their work has been delightfully harmonized with the architecture of the classroom building, designed by C. F. Cellarius, of Cincinnati. The Struck Construction Company has erected the entire edifice, while the College Departments of Heat and Power, and of Woodcraft (including plumbing and painting) have carried out the work of their respective branches, with the cooperation of Mr. William E. Bodenstein, Engineer, of Cincinnati.

The organ was built by the Moller Organ Company, Hagerstown, Maryland, and the windows are the creation of the Willet Stained Glass Company of Philadelphia.

Each workman has been a craftsman, and to each we would express our gratitude.

Flanking the west wall of the Chapel are the private rooms and office of the visiting clergyman, to the east is the Fireside Room, for informal religious gatherings of student groups.

On the east wall of the Chapel foyer is a copy of Hofmann's Christ in Gethsemane, on the opposite wall is the following inscription:

THE DANFORTH CHAPEL
DEDICATED TO
THE WORSHIP OF GOD
WITH THE PRAYER
THAT HERE
IN COMMUNION WITH THE HIGHEST
THE YOUTH OF BEREA
MAY ACQUIRE THE SPIRITUAL POWER
TO ASPIRE NOBLY
ADVENTURE DARINGLY
SERVE HUMBLY

Embedded in three exterior walls of the Chapel are stones of rare interest and significance. Among these are a stone with an inscription to Marduk, the God of Assyria, and a stone from a Byzantine Church of Istanbul; there are stones from the ancient memorials of Greece, there are stones from the places where Jesus walked and where his followers have walked, stones from Gethsemane, from Assisi, from Livingstonia; there are stones from shrines sacred to the rights of men and to the worship of God. All of these stones will speak to our students of the perpetuity and the universality of religion.
