JOHN WALKER Concert Organist

John Walker is Director of Music and Organist at The Riverside Church in New York City, a position he has held since 1983. In 1984 he became Chairman of the Organ Department at The Manhattan School of Music. As the director of an active and diverse musical program at Riverside, he performs regularly on the famous five manual Aeolian-Skinner organ which is located there. Along with his busy teaching schedule, he also appears each season in recitals throughout the nation.

John Walker earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at Stanford University and has double Master's degrees with honors from American Conservatory of Music in Chicago where he was also a faculty member.

Dr. Walker was the 1984 alumni recipient of the Professional Achievement Award from Westminster College in Pennsylvania. His teachers have included Herbert Nanney, Robert Lodine, and Raymond Ocock, and he has coached with Carl Weinrich, Jean Langlais, and Andre Machal.

CALVARY'S ORGANIST

Mr. Wiessinger came to the Clearwater area in 1976 to represent The Reuter Organ Company. He has been the organist at Calvary Baptist Church since January 1977.

During high school Mr. Wiessinger was assistant organist at his home church in Lima, Ohio at The First United Church of Christ. After receiving his B.S. degree in Zoology from the Ohio State University, Mr. Wiessinger taught ninth grade General Science and was appointed organist of St. Luke Lutheran Church in Lima. His brief organ study was with Dr. Wilbur Held and Dr. Gordon Wilson, both of the Ohio State University staff.

From 1971 until his move to Clearwater in 1976, he was associated with the main office of The Reuter Organ Company and at present, Mr. Wiessinger is sales/installation/service representative for The Reuter Organ Company in Florida and South Georgia.

CONCERNING OUR ORGAN

Built by The Reuter Organ Company of Lawrence, Kansas, Opus 2101 of the firm contains 60 ranks (sets) of pipes distributed over the four manual divisions and pedal of the organ. The 3,452 pipes of the organ are controlled by a solid state four manual drawknob moveable console employing a multiplex system and eight addressable memory banks. The tonal design of the organ was by Mr. Franklin Mitchell, Board Chairman of Reuter in collaboration with R. Joseph Wiessinger, Florida Representative for Reuter and organist of Calvary Baptist Church.

The custom designed and built instrument has a stunning facade (front) of real speaking pipes constructed of flamed copper, zinc and polished copper. Of special note are two horizontally mounted Trompettes en Chamade (trumpets on parade). The organ pipes range in size from 32' long to about 3/8" long and smaller than a pencil eraser, with the majority of the pipes located behind the facade in expression enclosures for dynamic variations. The blowing plant is located on the first floor and is powered by a 7 1/2 H.P. motor delivering 15 1/2" of static wind pressure. Metal and woods used in the construction of the organ are zinc, copper, tin, lead, poplar, birch, maple, rosewood and walnut.

Delivery of the instrument was in three semi truck loads with installation beginning February 13, 1989 and completion on April 1, 1989. Installation was under the supervision of Mr. Wiessinger assisted by Roger Banks, Stephen Barnhart, David Salmen, Mary Ann Jacobsen and James Swiger. Tonal Finishing was completed in mid April by Proctor Crow and Mr. Wiessinger under the direction of the Dean of Tonal Finishers, Mr. Franklin Mitchell.

Our new Reuter Pipe Organ is unique in design and installation and has been constructed specifically for the musical requirements of Calvary Baptist Church. Built to the highest possible standards both materially and tonally, this instrument will serve and lead us in worship for generations to come.

• This organ was given through the sacrificial gifts to the building program by the membership of Calvary Baptist Church.

CONCERNING OUR PIANOS


