Minor C. Baldwin, the favorite concert organist, so well known and liked in Meriden, has, in the current issue of the American Art Journal, published in New York, a criticism of the great organ in Chickering hall. A not inconsiderable experience with
the great Roosevelt organ in Chickering
hall induces me, from the standpoint of a
concert organist, to say a few words in
