

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For centuries the pipe organ has been associated closely with the church. It is the king of instruments. There is no more fitting instrument for the higher use of music—the praise and worship of God. It is a condensed orchestra, consisting of strings, woodwinds, and brass, plus the rich, dignified, foundation organ tone. The old 60 rank organ faithfully served the Pasadena Presbyterian Church for about 50 years. It has been replaced by a new 108 rank Aeolian-Skinner organ, dedicated to enrich music . . . that God might be glorified.
