

FEATURED DEDICATORY ARTIST JONATHAN RYAN, CONCERT ORGANIST

Acclaimed as "one of the brightest younger artists in the field today" (The Diapason), Jonathan Ryan consistently elicits acclaim for his "considerable depth of musicianship, imagination, and passion" (Ibid.), "sense of architecture" (Choir & Organ), and "great sensitivity within the composer's spirit" (Frankfurter Neue Presse). His command of an exceptionally large breadth of repertoire, spanning from the Renaissance to numerous solo and collaborative premieres, coupled with "true virtuosity" (Reutlingener Generalanzeiger) enables the bold, imaginative programming and exceptional use of each organ's unique capability for which he is noted. Especially concerned with communicating a work's essence, his ability to captivate listeners has "left the audience in a breathless awe" (Ibid.).

Mr. Ryan has the rare distinction of holding six First Prize awards at major international and national organ competitions. He most notably entered the international spotlight when awarded both First Prize and the only auxiliary prize, the LeTourneau Concerto Prize, in the 2009 Jordan II International Organ Competition.

Jonathan Ryan's newest recording entitled Influences, recorded on the Stahlhuth/Jann organ at St. Martin's Church, Dudelange Luxembourg, was released in December, 2015 on the independent boutique label, Acis and is available at jonathan-ryan.com. The recording features major works by Dupré and Willan, a premiere recording of Ad Wammes, and a commissioned piece by renowned English composer Philip Moore. His début solo organ recording, A Cathedral's Voice (Raven 941), was released to immediate critical acclaim, including a five-star review in the London-based Choir & Organ. Mr. Ryan's performances have been featured on the nationally syndicated radio programs Pipedreams and With Heart and Voice.

Solo performance engagements have taken him to numerous prominent venues, festivals, and conventions throughout the United States and Europe, including St. Paul's Cathedral in London (UK), the Nicolaikirche in Leipzig (Germany), the Cathédrale St-André in Bordeaux (France), international organ festivals in Zürich (Switzerland), Hamburg (Germany), Lübeck (Germany), the Piccolo Spoleto Festival's prestigious Spotlight Series (Charleston SC), the inaugural organ concert series at the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland CA, two full-length recitals at the 2014 Boston National Convention of the American Guild of Organists, and full-length recitals at three National Conventions of the Organ Historical Society. Mr. Ryan's current performance projects include recitals of J.S. Bach's monumental Clavier-Übung III in a tour on historically-based organs throughout the United States.

Born into a musical family in Charlotte, NC, Ryan first started playing the organ at age eight. He holds degrees from the Cleveland Institute of Music and Eastman School of Music, as well as the revered Fellow (FAGO) and Choirmaster (ChM) certifications from the American Guild of Organists.

In September, Mr. Ryan will be the Director of Music & Organist at St. Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church in Dallas TX. He also serves as faculty of the Church Music Association of America and their annual summer Colloquiums where he regularly gives lectures, masterclasses, and pursues one of his greatest interests in Western music: Gregorian chant.

HISTORY AND FUTURE OF CATHEDRAL'S PIPE ORGANS

The Cathedral of the Holy Trinity (present church of 1891) has a long and wonderful history of pipe organs, beginning with the famous New Ulm builder, Vogelpohl & Spaeth.

1903 - Vogelpohl & Spaeth (seen in backdrop)

1923 - Reuter Organ Co (Opus 97) II/21

1981 - Daniel Jaeckel (Opus 4) II/36

The last installed instrument suffered from numerous structural and mechanical problems, mostly due to poor maintenance and changes made to the instrument in the late 1980s. Roughly 95% (1500) of the pipes have been refurbished for reuse. German nomenclature as well as German crafted reed pipes will continue to tie the new instrument with its strong community and cultural heritage.

2017 - JFNordlie III/49

Our new pipe organ, with its casework and console built from solid hardwoods, now adorns the completely redesigned choir loft. The previous two-manual instrument was replaced with a new three-manual moveable console. Approximately 9 new sounds have been added (15 ranks), many of which are needed softer sounds, affording a greater versatility in use for congregational and choral singing, small and large ensembles, and concerts.

A new wind supply system has been installed within an enclosed room behind the choir loft, allowing the organ case to be slightly further back in the loft. This room also contains a state of the art humidification system, heater, and electronic panels--alas, no big screen tv. This in turn has created more room for choral and instrumental space. A new series of choir risers has been designed, with the moveable organ console in mind. Original church pews have been used for seating, as well as new chairs. The choir library was moved from 8 bulky file cabinets to an open file-box system, mounted on the wall. The choir loft flooring and trim work has been updated to blend with the beautiful hardwoods of the organ.

If one were to choose a few unique features of the organ, it would be the full POSITIV division, the creative use of various pipework to make numerous colorful mutations, and the sheer beauty of the flues and germanic reeds and nomenclature.

Overall, the new Cathedral pipe organ is much more functional and useable for the average organist, as well as more versatile and colorful for the professional organist. It is more capable of leading congregational song, providing a model of Sacred music and Liturgy for the Diocese, and promote the performing arts for the civic and greater Minnesota community.
