## Description

The two manual and pedal instrument is contained in two heavy-walled louvered boxes, with the exception of the Open Diapason in facade. The casework and console are built of native white pine, stained to match existing woodwork. Case carvings are of pine, enameled and gilded. The console, detached and reversed, operates mechanical key and coupler actions and electrical stop motors. A solid-state combination system controls both general and divisional memories. Winding is via a single cuneiform bellows and high speed blower at 62mm.

The instrument comprises 21 stops, contains 990 pipes, 39 bells and tremulant.

The carved, gilded and arcaded manual keys are made of cherry, plated with cow bone. Sharps are made of ebony. Pedal keys are of oak, plated with maple or black walnut. The turned ebony stops knobs are faced with holly plates.
