

INSTALLATION OF A NEW PIPE ORGAN AT METHODIST CHURCH

Installation of the new \$9,000 pipe organ at the First Methodist Episcopal church has been completed, and it will be put into service for the first time on Sunday, May 31, when a dedication program will be given.

Three musical programs are to be given during dedication week. After the ceremonies on Sunday, a grand concert will be given Tuesday evening, June 2, and an organ recital will be given Thursday evening, June 4.

The Rev. W. P. Leek, superintendent of the Fond du Lac district of the Methodist conference, will be present to assist in the dedication program, which is to be held at 7:30 p. m., Sunday evening. He will deliver the sermon for the evening.

The organ is the product of the Austin Organ company, of Hartford, Conn., and it was purchased and installed at a cost exceeding \$9,000. A complete description follows:
