Hylton Will Perform At Organ Dedication

HAMPSTEAD — A well-known local organist, Brent E. Hylton, assistant professor of music at Western Maryland College, will be the guest recitalist at the dedicatory recital on the new M. P. Moller pipe organ in St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Hampstead.

The recital will be at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 12. The organ was installed a few weeks ago and was dedicated at a special service in October by the Rev. Dr. Paul M. Orso, president of the Maryland Synod of the Lutheran Church in America, with the assistance of the pastor of St. Mark's, the Rev. William Coley Roeger.

By a strange coincidence, Hylton's wife, Marilyn Hylton, is now the director of music at St. Mark's Church, but Hylton was asked to play this recital prior to her being employed by the church. They are both extremely talented organists and musicians.

Hylton holds the degree of bachelor of music from the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester, one of the finest university schools of music in the country, as well as the master of music degree from Syracuse University. He is earning a doctorate in musical arts from the Eastman School of Music.

At Western Maryland College, he teaches organ and piano and conducts the college choir. He has performed throughout the United States and Europe. He is also director of music at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Hanover, Pa.

Prior to coming to Western Maryland, Hylton taught for six years at Syracuse University in the School of Music and was the organist and choirmaster at Hendricks Chapel of that university.

The organ upon which Hylton will be playing was originally built in part by the M. P. Moller Co. and installed in the church in 1941. A year ago, it was decided by the congregation to have the organ completely rebuilt and enlarged, and it has now been doubled in size and made much more flexible as an instrument.

It was completely removed in May of this year and taken to the Moller Company's factory in Hagerstown.

Although the compositions to be included in the recital have not yet been announced by Hylton, they will be chosen to

show off the flexibility and tonal qualities of the instrument as well as Hylton's own superb musicianship.
