New information was discovered via "The Dansville Express" from December 2, 1886. The following appeared on page 3.

The organ for St. Peter's church which the ladies have worked so industriously for arrived last week and it is now being set up by Mr. Charles Viner of Westfield, Mass., and Mr. W. H. Welch of this village. The organ which occupies the annex built for it a short time ago, is two manual, has a black walnut and decorated front, the pipes being tinted in buff, blue and gold. It was made at Westfield by W. A. Johnson, the specifications being as follows:
