-A GRAND ORGAN CONCERT will be given at Gethermane Raptist Church, Lightcenth street and Columbia avenue, on Thursday evening next, at which such eminent musicians as Messra David Ward, F. T. S. Daley, Hugh A. Clark, C. F. Bund ner and Harry J. Keely will assist, attended by a chorus of forty voices. Tickets may be had at its nner's. No. 1102 Chestnut street.

Grand Organ Concert.

A grand organ concert took place on Thursday evening at the Getheemane Baptist Church, corner of highteenth street and Columbia avenue, in the presence of a crowded audience. The new organ built for this church has two full banks of manual keys, extending in compass from CC to A in alto. and one bank of pedal keys, extending from CCC

to D.

The number of sounding stops are 24, with 1764 speaking pipes attached thereto. The number of mechanical stops are 4, making in all 28 actual draw stops. The manuals and pedals me placed in a separate case, distinct from the organ case, some four feet in front of the latter. The organist, thus seated, has his eye upon every member of the

choir, and vice versa.
Some portions of the movements of this instrument extend a distance of twenty six feet, while the slowest movements are no less than tou feet. The bulk of these movements approximate more to the higher than the lesses figures; though such is the condition of these movements, the pressure se quired to push down the keys is on the average less than that required on the best make of planos, which is directly performed with the keys, and this has been accomplished without the aid of pneumatics in any form. The organ is a remarkably sweet toned instrument, and the concert was in every respect a success.

The organists were Messrs. Divil Wood, Hugh A. Clarke, F. T. S. Darley, C. F. Blandner and Henry J. Keely. The vocasists were Mis. H. G. C. Ramberger, Miss Annie Schubert, Miss Annie Miller, Miss Kite Koons, Miss Mary Jones, Mcsas. W. A. Briscoe, F. J. Milony, George Roden, William H. Boner and D. Morrison, and a chorus of forty volcas. forty voices. The grand overtme to William Tell was especially well rendered by Mr. David Wood, the bind organist of ht Stephen's Church. A large amount was, doubtless, realized, and the proceeds will be for the benefit of the organ fund.
