E. & G. G. Hook, Op. 359, 1865

One manual with pedal, mechanical action

Rebuilt by Andover Organ Company in 1998, R231

From 1865 to 1897, Op. 350 was in a Methodist church in Chatham, Massachusetts. So that the church could have a new larger Hook organ, it was sold to a Congregationalist church where it resided until 1945 when it was sold to a Baptist congregation. The Baptist church was partially destroyed by fire in 1974, the organ receiving damage to the case and some pipes. The Andover Organ Company of Methuen, MA placed it in storage in preparation for restoring and rebuilding.

Through various communications, Robert Hawkins who at the time was at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary oversaw ways for Christ the King Lutheran in Columbia to have it revitalized and moved. Then in 2021 Christ the King church was closed and the organ was moved to St. Michael Lutheran. Lincoln Pipe Organs, Inc. moved and installed the organ.

St. Michael is a 1922 building now housing an 1865 organ.
