

MUSIC FOR THE MILLION.

**The New Pipe Organ at the Congregational Church Nearly Ready for Use
—A Mammoth Instrument with an Excellent Tone.**

It will well repay the admirer of handsome musical instruments for a visit to the Congregational church in this city at the present time, where can be seen an elegant pipe organ recently contracted for by the congregation with the Moline, Ill., Pipe Organ Company, at a cost of about \$3,000. The instrument arrived some days since and is now up and will be ready for use this evening. The work of putting it together has been superintended by Mr. John Lancashire, president of the Moline company, and superintendent of the mechanical department. Mr. Lancashire is one of the best organ builders in this country and has taken especial pains in the construction of the Congregational society's instrument. The instrument frame is built of black walnut, elegantly finished. In front of the organ are forty-five display pipes, from eight to thirteen feet high. The height of the instrument is

TWENTY-FOUR FEET,
and is sixteen feet wide and ten feet deep. The following specifications of the mammoth instrument are taken from last evening's *Globe* and are correct:

GREAT ORGAN MANUALE.—Bourdon, 16 feet, 58 pipes; open diapason, 8 feet, 58; Violin Diapason, 8 feet, 58; Melodia, 8 feet, 58; Dulciana, 8 feet, 58; Principal, 4 feet, 58; Harmonic Flute, 4 feet, 58; Twelfth, 2½ feet, 58; Fifteenth, 2 feet, 58; Clarionette, 8 feet, 46;

SWELL MANUALE.—Viola di Gamba, 8 feet, 58 pipes; Stop Diapason, 8 feet, 58; Salicional, 8 feet, 58; Quintadena, 8 feet, 58; Fagata, 4 feet, 58; Flute Traverso, 4 feet, 58; Violini, 2 feet, 58; Oboe, 8 feet, 58; Bassoon, 8 feet, 58; Tremolo.

PEDAL ORGAN.—Gd. Op. Diapason, 16 feet, 27 pipes; Sub bass, 16 feet, 27 pipes. and swell to great; swell to pedal; great to pedal; pedal check and wind signal.

PEDAL MOVEMENTS.—Piano, mizzo, Forte, balanced swell pedal. The scheme of organ compass of manual is CC to A in alt., 58 notes. The compass of pedals CCC to D, 27 notes. There are 1,086 pipes in all.

The great organ will be in perfect working order by this evening, and in honor of its being housed, a grand musical entertainment, under the leadership of Prof. Louis Falk, will be given at the church on Saturday and Monday evenings next, which will be well worth attending. The church society hope to be able to pay for their elegant instrument before a great while, and take this as a means of raising part of the funds. The members of the church are deserving of great credit and assistance for their undertaking, and we hope their preliminary step towards procuring an organ that is an ornament and honor to their church will but incite other churches to a similar step. Attend the concerts and hear the wonderfully beautiful tones as they proceed from the new organ under the touch of a master hand.
