Welcome and Introduction

Litany of Dedication

Pastor: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we dedicate this organ to the praise of our God and to the inspiration of all God's creation.

People: Praise God in His sanctuary;
Praise God in the firmament of His power.
Praise God with the sound of the trumpet;
Praise God with psaltery and harp.

Pastor: We dedicate this organ to the service of God's people in prayer, to an appreciation of the great doxologies of the Church, and to the development of the language of praise on earth and in heaven.

People: Praise God with stringed instruments and organs.
Let everything that has breath praise the Lord.

Pastor: We dedicate this organ to the cultivation of art, to the interpretation of the message of music. We dedicate it to the growth of those who would learn, and to the art of music among persons of all ages.

People: O sing to the Lord a new song;

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

Pastor: Let us pray. Oh God, the angel choirs and saints above give glory to your name in heaven. We give you thanks for musicians, and ask you to bless their efforts to use music to lift your people's hearts and voices in praise, for through our worship, we experience the fullness of your love and grace, and catch a glimpse of the glory and beauty of your kingdom. As your servant, David, sang songs of thanksgiving and praise, give grace and blessing to all who use their voices to guide us in our worship, that with hymns and psalms and spiritual songs, we may sing and make music to the glory of your name.

We give thanks for this organ, and we pray your spirit be with us as we dedicate and consecrate this organ in your name. May your presence come upon those who play it to honor your name. Use this instrument to touch those who offer their prayers here, that they may come to know and love and serve you more completely. Your spirit has called and inspired many through the beauty of Beth Eden and the care of this community of faith. May this organ continue to call forth new expression worthy of your Son, Jesus Christ, for it is in his name that we pray. Amen.

CASAVANT FRÈRES

Of all the musical instruments humankind has ever heard, few compare with the history, versatility, complexity, and majesty of the pipe organ. This world-renowned pipe organ builder is located in a series of three-story clapboard buildings outside Montreal in St-Hyacinthe, Québec. The Casavant Frères Company, one of the oldest and most venerable pipe organ makers in North America, has completed nearly 4,000 organs to date. Using primarily woods, tin, lead, and iron, artisans painstakingly design and craft the wind reservoirs, circuits and springs, manuals and pedalboard, ranks of pipes, stops and controls to blend a variety of timbres, volumes, and voices for the glory of God. This organ is sure to enhance the worship and inspire the worshipers to sing the praises of the Almighty God for hundreds of years to come.

About the Artist

Dr. Vincent Crist is in his eighth year as Director of Music and Organist at the Church of the Ascension (Episcopal) in Hickory, where he conducts the Adult, Children's, and Handbell Choirs and administers the Friends of Music Concert Series.

A native of Asheville, he holds the degrees of Bachelor of Environmental Design in Architecture (with honors) from North Carolina State University, the BA in Music from Warren Wilson college, where he received the Mary Emma Gage Prize in Music, and the Master of Music in Church Music (with distinction) from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ. In 1993, he received the degree of Doctor of Musical Arts in Performance Studies from the College-Conservatory of Music of the University of Cincinnati. Dr. Crist has also studied at the University of Kentucky and at the Conservatory of Music in Vienna, Austria.

Dr. Crist has studied organ with Schuyler Robinson, Eugene Roan, Harald Vogel, Guy Bovet, and Roberta Gary, and conducting with Robert Keener, John Kemp, Joseph Flummerfelt, and John Leman.

He has served churches in North Carolina, New Jersey, Kentucky, and Ohio, and has served on the faculties of Montreat College, the University of Kentucky, and the University of Cincinnati.

In addition to his duties at the Church of the Ascension, Dr. Crist is active as a lecturer and consultant in organ design and in the acoustics of worship spaces. He is in his second term as Dean of the Hickory Chapter of the American Guild of
