Reading of Dedicational Purpose

Litany of Dedication of the new organ

Leader: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we dedicate this Organ to the praise of Almighty God and the inspiration of mortal men.

People: Praise God in His sanctuary: praise Him in the firmament of His power. Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; praise Him with psaltery and harp.

Leader: We dedicate this Organ to the cultivation of a high art; to the interpretation of the message of the masters of music, to an appreciation of the great doxologies of the Church, and to the development of the language of praise which belongeth both to earth and heaven.

People: Praise Him with stringed instruments and organs. Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord.
