Ty Woodward holds a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance and a Master's Degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Southern California. Formerly a Dean of the Los Angeles Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, he has also served on the Commission of Liturgy and Music for the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles. Currently, Mr. Woodward is Staff Organist at the El Capitan Theatre in Hollywood playing the Mighty Wurlitzer Theatre Pipe Organ. He is also Organist and Choirmaster at St. Barnabas Episcopal Church, Scottsdale, Arizona, where, in addition to playing the organ, he conducts the semi-professional choir, and supervises the junior choir program and the parish carilloneurs.

Solo performances, both classical and theatre organ concerts, include Westminster Abbey in London; Trinity Church, New York City; The National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, DC; St. James Cathedral, Toronto; Shea's Theatre of the Performing Arts, Buffalo; the Paramount Theatre, Cedar Rapids; The Alabama Theatre, Birmingham; and the outdoor pipe organ at Balboa Park in San Diego. Mr. Woodward has played several major works with orchestra, including the *Symphonie Concertante*, of Joseph Jongen and Saint-Saens *Symphony No. 3.*

He has worked with numerous churches in design and installation for their new pipe organs and is the area representative for the Schantz Organ Company of Orrville, Ohio.
