GENERAL DETAILS OF CONSTRUCTION.

- (a) LOCATION: Organ to be located in chamber prepared for it.
- (b) CONSOLE: Console containing Four Manuals and One Pedal for Manual and Pedal playing, and equipped with the Aeolian Company's Combination Duo-Art (automatic) and Solo (semi-automatic) music roll mechanism to be located as hereafter determined.
- (c) <u>CASEWORK:</u> Grilles for Organ, and casework for Console, and Organist's bench, are not included in this contract.
- (d) <u>BLOWING APPARATUS</u>: Blowing apparatus, including an efficient electric motor wired to suit local electric conditions, and a separate motor generator to furnish low voltage for the Organ mechanism, to be furnished by Organ builders and located in position hereafter determined.
- (e) PURCHASER AGREES: Purchaser agrees to install the necessary galvanized iron windtrunking from blowing apparatus to Organ and Console, under direction of Organ builders, and to bear all expense of wiring, conduiting, and similar details incidental to the installation of the Organ.

It is understood that if, in the opinion of said Company, the Organ chambers in or said College are not in proper condition to receive said Organ forty-five days prior to said installation, the said College agrees to pay all storage, drayage, insurance, and other charges resulting from the failure to have said chambers or College in proper condition to receive said Organ.

It is further understood and agreed that said Organ is at the risk of said College, against damage by fire, or water, on and after arrival upon its premises; and further, that the title ownership of said Organ shall remain vested in said Company until said Organ is fully paid for as hereinbefore provided.
