ORGAN DEDICATED AT ZION REFORMED

Impressive Services—Sermon By Rev. Paul S. Leinbach.

The New Haskell Organ, of Zion's Reformed church was dedicated yesterday morning with impressive services. Rev. Paul S. Leinbach, of Easton, preached a fine sermon on the Psalm 150:6 "Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord," this sentiment being inscribed on the walnut case of the organ.

Rev. Leinbach preached an impres-

sive sermon.

Though the organ is really not fully completed the organist, Harold Marks, played exceedingly well and the choir was at its best. The anthem "I will sing of thy Power O God," was sung at the opening and "The Lord Great Wonders Hath," at the close.

The dedicatory service was conducted by Rev. Simon Sipple and was

very impressive.

At this service \$751.68 was gathered; in the afternoon \$85, and in the evening \$185.12 making a total of \$1022 for the day. A large audience was in attendance at the evening service.

In the organ are 1934 pipes, 488 for the great organ, 718 for the swell, 499 for the choir and 163 for the pedal organ. In addition the great organ will have 61 extra notes and 99 notes

for the pedal organ.

The audiences that were so much interested in the new organ yesterday did not know that at all the services there was a man on the inside. Ferdnand Rassmann, who with his brother Paul is erecting the organ was on the inside watching that all the movements were kept going properly There are still 3 stops to be added and 164 pipes. The chimes are not yet adjusted. Organist Marks had only a few hours practice on the organ before yesterday's services. In the course of a week the organ will be fully completed.
