

Newtown Methodists To Dedicate New Organ

NEWTOWN, Sept. 8 — Dedication services for the installation of the new pipe organ in the Methodist Episcopal Church will be held at the regular service on Sunday morning. The Rev. A. M. Witwer, D. D., of Philadelphia, district superintendent, will preach the morning sermon. He will be assisted by the pastor, the Rev. Carl R. Hammerly.

Miss Estelle Pownall will be at the console. A solo will be sung by Miss Grace Sherman and an anthem will be given by the church choir.

Ever since the erection of the church building, at the corner of Liberty and Greene streets, here, the need for a pipe organ has been expressed. This Spring, after a lengthy controversy, the congregation voted to buy the pipe organ, which was paid for by personal subscription and pledges of members, together with monthly Fellowship suppers.

The organ is a two manual instrument, with seven sets of pipes. The organ contains 702 pipes and 33 stops. The whole effect will blend with the architecture of the church.

The interior of the church has been repainted and new lights have been installed as a memorial to the late Miss Anna Skeer, long a member and benefactor of the church. The lights will be dedicated at the evening service.

The twilight dedication service will have Miss Dorothy Faust, of Philadelphia, as the guest organist. The church trio will sing special vocal numbers.
