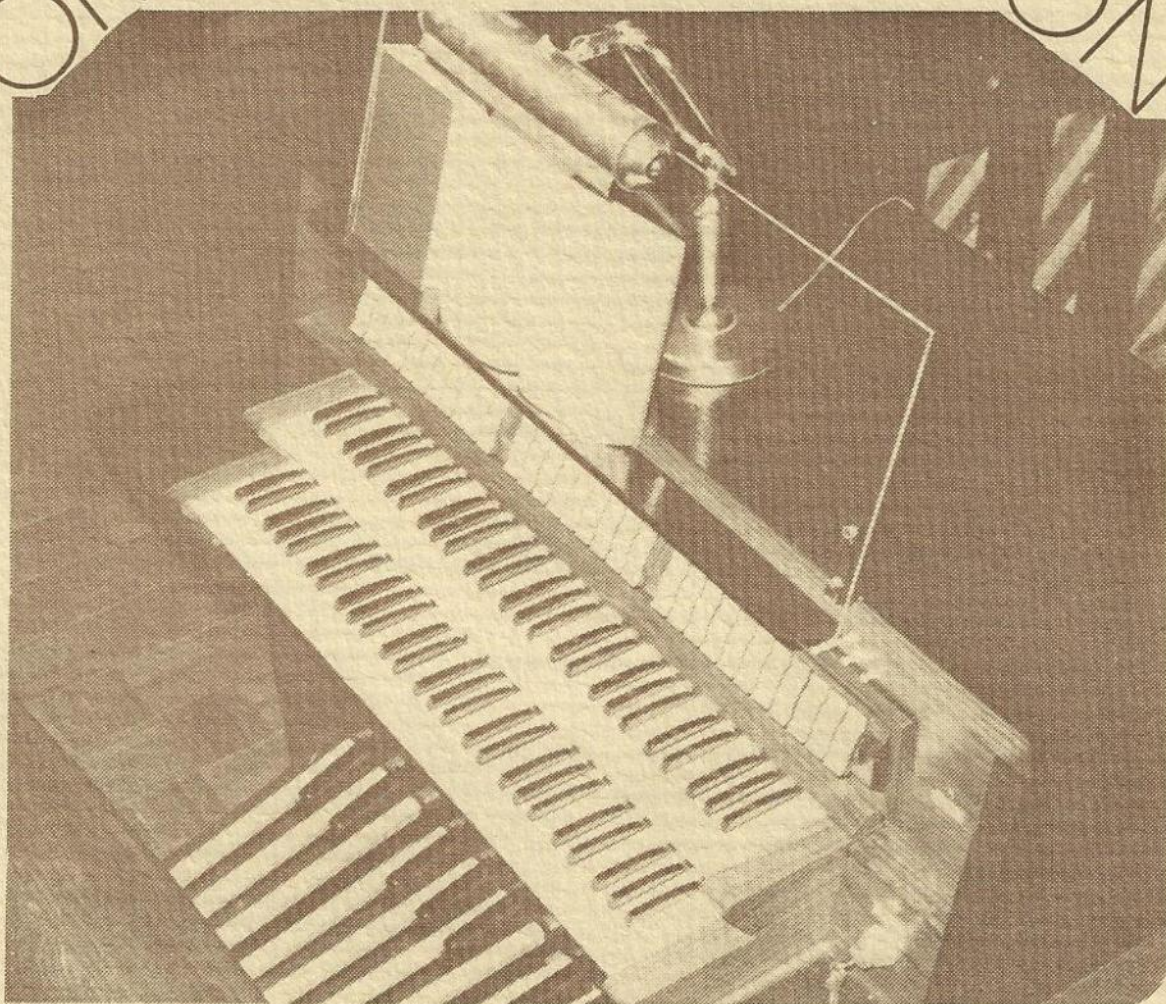

† ROBERT PRICHARD †

ROBERT PRICHARD received his early musical training in California's San Joaquin Valley. After a short service tour of duty, during which he served Ft. Lewis, Washington, as Organist of the Post Chapel, he entered the School of Music at the University of Southern California. He holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from USC, where he studied piano and harpsichord with Alice Ehlers and John Crown. His Master's degree was awarded with Departmental Honors in Music History and Literature. During this time he was an organ student of Clarence Mader.

He has taught organ, piano or harpsichord at Whittier College, Biola College, the Los Angeles Conservatory and currently is a member of the music faculty at Long Beach Community College where he teaches piano and music theory. He also teaches organ and harpsichord at Occidental College.

As organist/director of the Pasadena Presbyterian Church he has been heard by a wide radio audience in more than one thousand organ recital broadcasts. He has played numerous recitals in Southern California and various cities in the West, has appeared with symphony orchestras and recorded for radio and films.

In the Spring of 1971 he played concerts in Germany and France. As one of two invited American participants in the "International Organ Weeks in Westfalia," he performed eight concerts, concluding with recitals in Berlin and at Notre Dame, Paris.

† ORGANS AT MESSIAH LUTHERAN CHURCH †

After much research of the congregational minutes, it was discovered that the first instrument to lead the singing at Messiah Lutheran Church was not an organ but an old upright piano. This was first used in our storefront house of worship on Third Street in 1942. We know nothing about the piano except for one entry in the congregation minutes of May 10, 1948, which states that a piano tuner advised that it was a waste of money to attempt to repair the piano.

The piano was placed in the new church when the congregation moved from its storefront building to the present location on Paramount Blvd. in 1947. In February of 1949, an Organ Fund is mentioned for the first time; a used Orgatron was purchased for \$600 in April, 1950. This first organ was electric with only one manual and no pedalboard. This instrument served the congregation for about five years and was sold to the Carson Street Baptist Church of Hawaiian Gardens for \$375.

In December, 1955, a Connsonatta Concert Model Organ was placed in our church on a trial basis. This instrument, an electric organ with two manuals and a full pedalboard, was purchased in early 1956 for \$3,476.25. It has led God's Children in singing His praises for the last 23 years.

When our remodeled house of worship was rededicated in 1974, it was the dream of this parish to have a new pipe organ. An Organ Fund was established some years previous with a generous gift from a former member, Ivan Huelle, who was also the church organist. An Organ Committee was established and chaired by Dr. Merlin Newkirk. After many meetings and a great deal of research, the Organ Committee recommended to the Voters' Assembly that we accept the bid of the Schlicker Organ Company, Buffalo, New York, to build a two manual and pedal organ for \$38,694.

We give thanks to God on this Organ Dedication Day that He has heard our prayers and given us this magnificent organ to lead us in praising His name. May all who play it and sing with it use their talents to His greater glory!

† THE SCHLICKER PIPE ORGAN †

The beautiful pipe organ which you view in the choir area in the rear of the church is a culmination of many prayers for a dream of this congregation. It is with joyful hearts that we dedicate this magnificent instrument to the glory of God!

The two manual and pedal organ was built by Schlicker Organ Company, Inc., Buffalo, New York, the specification was designed by our consultant and organist, Mr. Michael Doyle, in consultation with Mr. Robert Prichard, area representative of the Schlicker Organ Company. The tonal finishing of the organ was the work of Mr. Louis M. Rothenbueger, Jr. and Mr. Wilfred Miller.

The preparations for the new organ were begun in March of 1978. The carpets and risers in the choir area had to be removed for the placement of the pipes, a beautiful new oak parquet floor was installed, and the acoustical ceiling of the choir area was painted to improve the sound. At about the same time the congregation was advised by the organ company and many others that all the carpets should be removed from the church proper in order to enhance the singing. A special Voters' Assembly meeting was held to consider this recommendation. After much discussion, the voters voted to remove all the carpet and to install oak parquet flooring throughout the church. All of this work was completed with the volunteer labor of the men and women of this parish. By July all the preparations were finished and the church was ready for the arrival of the new organ.

The location of the organ was of paramount importance to the Organ Committee. After much discussion, the Committee recommended that the organ be placed in the east end of the building with the choir. With the organ and the choir in the back of the church, the sound can travel more easily on the main axis of the building and thus give the congregation more support in their singing. This placement follows a traditional Lutheran custom.

Our organ of 8 ranks of pipes and 29 stops is by no means the largest organ in the Downey area; but it is unique, as it is of classical design and is housed in its own case, speaking in the room where it is placed instead of being buried in some far distant chamber. In front of the case, which contains the majority of the pipes, are the bottom 12 pipes of the 16' Fagott, 8' Salicional and the 8' Principal. These bright shining pipes are aesthetically pleasing to view. To the right of these metal pipes are 12 wooden pipes from the 16' Gedectbass in the pedal organ which are made from solid oak.

The flue pipework of tin, lead, zinc and oak was made by the Schlicker Organ Company, the reed pipes were made by Carl Giesicke and Sohn of Germany, and the mixture was also made in Germany. There are a total of 494 pipes in the organ, from 8 feet in length to a mere $\frac{3}{4}$ inch.

The oak console with walnut inlays has 31 tilting-tablets, 2 general combination pistons with one release piston, and one toe stud for the six bell Zimbelstern which was given along with the Chimes preparation as a gift to the church from a family of this parish.

The organ has six basic independent registers with eight ranks of pipes. These registers, when used independently, form a straight organ chorus. Tonal flexibility and varied tonal color is increased by the judicious unification on the manuals and in the pedal. The organ is voiced on low wind pressure of 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches which is consistent with the Baroque voicing principal of organ building with a minimal nicking of the languids of the flue pipes. Each set of pipes has been voiced in such a manner as to permit its own individual character and yet blend and contribute to the entire ensemble. The wind chests are modified electro-pneumatic chests. Between each pipe and its controlling valve there is a specially bored "Tone-Kanzelle" of maximum cubic capacity. This volume of inert air cushions the speech of the pipes and produces characteristics normally obtainable only from slide chests.

The main purpose of the organ in the Lutheran Church is to lead, support and inspire the congregation and choir in their songs of praise to God. The secondary function is to supply service music which aids the worshiper in his worship. This beautiful instrument will meet both requirements, since it is capable of playing the great heritage of Lutheran music and the music of any given period of organ literature.

With thankful hearts, we dedicate this organ to the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. "To Him who loves us and freed us from our sins with His life's blood, who made of us a royal house, to serve as the priests of His God and Father to Him be Glory and Dominion for ever and ever! Amen" (Revelation 1:6)
