**Scott Church's New Pipe Organ.**  
Scott M. E. Church was crowded last night at the testing of the new pipe organ built by J. B. Didinger & Co. of Philadelphia at a cost of \$1,500. Prof. Frederick Maxson of Philadelphia was the organist. Thomas S. Meteer, a former Wilmingtonian, gave readings and Miss Katharine D. Sheain of Philadelphia sang. In the rendition of "The Last Hymn," Mr. Meteer was assisted by Miss Mabel Hart, as soloist and C. F. Pondy, accompanist. Miss Sheain's singing was much appreciated. The audience was pleased with the new organ, on which Prof. Maxson played "Offertoire de St. Cecilia," by Grison, his own "Grand Chorus in D," and other numbers. The concert closed with the doxology.
