


Organ Rededication Service First Lutheran Church Chattanooga, TN







Original Wicks Organ Dedication May 17, 1970

First Lutheran Marks Milest Sunday With New Pipe Or

ORGAN RESTORATION PROJECT HISTORY OF THE WICKS ORGAN AT FIRST LUTHERAN

When the current First Lutheran Church building at 2800 McCallie Avenue was completed in 1960 there was no organ. The previous location had a small pipe organ which had been moved to the University of Chattanooga.

In 1969 a committee was formed to research organ builders and costs. John Krause was the committee chairman, with committee members Pastor Leroy Buuck, organist and choir director Dan Johnson, Dot Wade, Colleen Schwab and Walter Meyer. After much research, the committee selected Wicks Organ Company of Highland, Illinois, to design and build the new organ.

The Wick brothers, early pioneers of all-electric organ actions, had been building pipe organs since the early 20th century, creating and servicing organs throughout the country.

The organ at First Lutheran was custom designed to take advantage of the unique circular design of the sanctuary. William Rozeboom, Wicks Regional Director, noted the brick and glass sanctuary "provides an excellent acoustical environment for the new organ."

The 20-rank, 3-division organ enclosed in cherry casework was completed in time for the Sunday morning worship service on May 17, 1970. The Chattanooga News-Free Press noted in the May 16, 1970, edition that the organ represented "another milestone in the continuing growth and expansion of First Lutheran Church…"
