

## Organ Dedication Recital

### THE ORGAN

The new pipe organ for Wieuca Road Baptist Church was built by M. P. Moller Organ Company of Hagerstown, Maryland, the largest builder of pipe organs in the world. They are nationally known for the exceptional quality of their instruments.

The organ is playable from a four manual console (Positif, Great, Swell, Antiphonal). This magnificent console is finished to match our church furniture, and contains 101 draw knobs, 26 tilting tablets, 41 manual pistons, 26 toe pistons, and separate controls for chimes and harp.

The Great, Swell, Positif, and Pedal divisions of the organ are installed on both sides of the choir loft. Some of the pipes of the Great Organ are handsomely displayed. The pipes of the Antiphonal Organ are installed in two locations in the balcony.

The tonal design was planned by the officials of the Moller Company in collaboration with Mr. Jack Gantt, our Minister of Music.

Our pipe organ was completely handcrafted, and was built in its entirety at the plant in Hagerstown. After the organ was completed at the factory it was assembled, tested, and then disassembled for shipment to the church. Every pipe organ that the Moller Company builds is treated in this same manner. The building of a pipe organ employs literally scores of craftsmen from its beginning through its completion. The final tonal finishing of the organ was under the direction of Mr. Donald M. Gillett, tonal director for the Moller Company.

Our new organ has 78 ranks, contains 4,447 pipes, and weighs in excess of 13 tons. It is designed to play all types of organ literature, accompany choirs, soloists and congregation, and to be an ideal instrument for our particular church. There is not another organ exactly like it anywhere in the world, for every pipe organ is created specifically for each church. With proper care, it will serve us and lead us in worship for generations!
