A LITANY OF DEDICATION

Minister: Dearly beloved, we learn from the Holy Scriptures that devout men and women set apart temples for the worship of God and used musical instruments therein for His praise and adoration. We therefore assemble here for the purpose of dedicating this organ for service in the worship of Almighty God. The importance of music in worship has long been recognized by the people of God. From earliest times, people have built musical instruments to glorify God and inspire divine worship. The modern organ is the culmination of centuries of instrument building. It is one of the most ancient and venerable of all musical instruments, essentially ecclesiastical in its traditions. It is fitting that the organ be dedicated to the worship of Almighty God. For such a dedication we are assembled here today.

At the dedication of Solomon's Temple, we read that all the Levites who were singers with . . . "their sons and kinsmen, arrayed in fine linen, with cymbals, harps, and lyres, stood east of the altar with a hundred and twenty priests who were trumpeters; and it was the duty of the trumpeters and singers to make themselves heard in unison in praise and thanksgiving to the Lord, and when the song was raised, with trumpets and cymbals and other musical instruments, in praise to the Lord, 'For He is good, for His steadfast love endures for ever,' the house, of the Lord, was filled with a cloud, so that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud; for the glory of the Lord filled the house of God."

(II Chronicles 5:12-14)

And now, may the glory of the Lord fill this house as we dedicate this organ, and our lives as well, to God and to the service of our Lord. Please join me, responsively, in this act of dedication.

Congregation: With gratitude in our hearts we have come to this hour.

Minister: To the glory of God the Father, before Whom the morning stars sang and the people of God shouted for joy when the foundations of the earth were laid, Who for us and our salvation gave His only-begotten Son, and Who puts a new song in our hearts:

Congregation: To the praise of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour, Whose birth the angels proclaimed and to Whom the heavenly host will sing, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and wisdom and strength, and honor, and glory, and blessing."

Minister: To the Holy Spirit, our Comforter and ever-present Helper, Who alone can move us to praise, and Who with the Father and the Son we worship and glorify as one God, world without end;

Congregation: To enable God's children, as they lift their voices in prayer and praise, to worthily magnify His great and holy Name;

Minister: To awaken within us a greater vision of God's creative beauty, a deeper sense of His love, and the marvels of His grace; to inspire us to higher devotion to God and greater service to our fellow human beings.

Congregation: To the celebration of festive days, to the healing of life's inner troubles with soul-refreshing melody, to the improving of our own days;

Minister: For the winning of the lost, the lifting up of the fallen, the comforting of those who grieve, the strengthening of the weak, the challenging of the strong, the teaching of the young; and, bringing blessing and joy to all who pass this way;

Congregation: We dedicate this organ.

Minister and Congregation: O God, by Your servant Moses You commanded that Your people should praise Your Holy Name, with the joyful and majestic sound of musical instruments as well as with the commitment of every aspect of our lives to Your service. Bless, we pray, this organ which we now dedicate to Your honor and glory. We remember with gratitude the gifts and human efforts which made this organ possible. May we be worthy recipients of these acts of love and devotion, for Thine alone is the Kingdom, and the Power, and the Glory, forever. Amen.

THE HYMN OF DEDICATION: Sung to the tune LASST UNS ERFREUEN, a melody from *Geistliche Kirchengesänge*, 1623, arranged by Ralph Vaughan Williams and Karen Keene. Verse 1 is from the hymn "All Creatures of Our God and King" by Francis of Assisi, 1182-1226. Verses 2, 3, 4, and 5 were written by Karen Keene for the dedication of the new organ at First United Methodist Church, Erie, Pennsylvania.

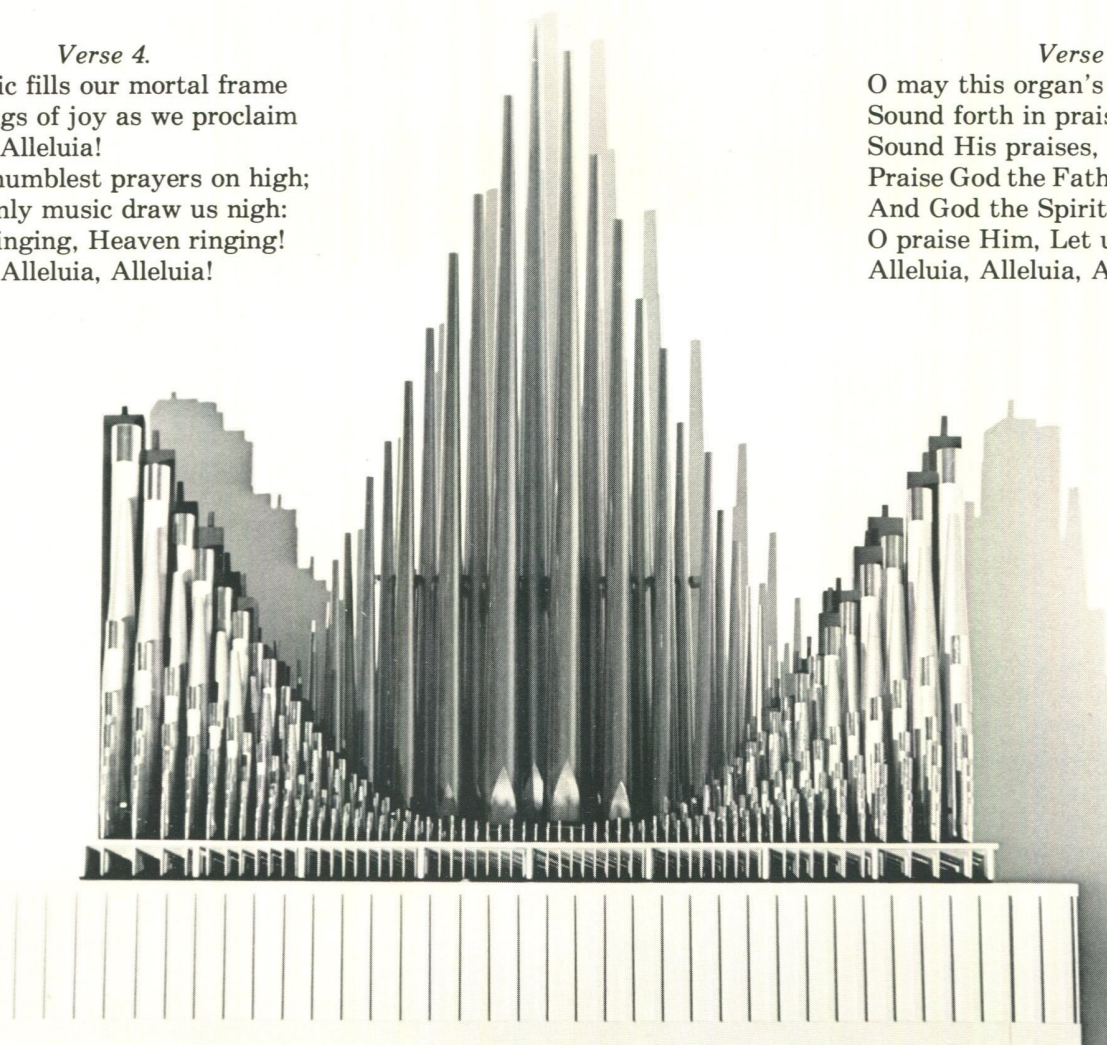

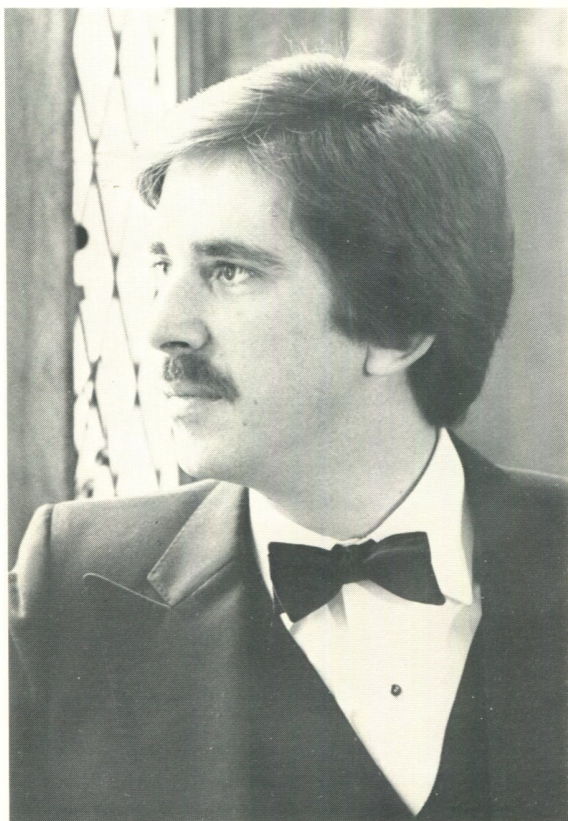

Stephen and Susan Talley have served as Director of Music and Organist, respectively, at the First Presbyterian Church in Delray Beach since 1982. Stephen earned a Bachelor of Music Degree from Westminster College and a Master of Music Degree in Organ Performance from the State University of New York at Fredonia. His organ professors include Raymond H. Ocock and John T. Hofmann. He served the Wayside United Presbyterian Church in Erie, PA, for six years as Organist/Director of Music and taught on the music faculty of Mercyhurst College in Erie. During this time he also directed the Symphonic Singers of Erie, a community chorus. Susan attended Princeton University, where she earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in French Language and Literature while serving as Assistant to the University Chapel

Organist/Choirmaster, Dr. Carl Weinrich. She also studied organ with Eugene Roan at Westminster Choir College and after graduation pursued graduate organ study at the Royal Danish Conservatory in Copenhagen. After returning to the U.S., she was appointed the first female "Organ Fellow" at the Washington Cathedral. She then served as Organist/Assistant to the Minister of Music at the First United Presbyterian Church of the Covenant in Erie, PA, for five years.

In 1983 the Talleys organized the Delray Beach Chorale, a community chorus of 70 voices, which performs choral masterworks with orchestra at two concerts each season. They have performed as a duo-organist team in a dedicatory recital in Erie and at the Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Ft. Lauderdale.

Douglas Major joined the Washington Cathedral staff in 1974 as assistant organist and choirmaster and in 1979 became the associate organist and choirmaster to Richard W. Dirksen. Mr. Major's responsibilities include recruiting and training the Cathedral choirboys and playing for over 250 musical services each year. He has given recitals in twenty states and appeared as soloist in the 1982 American Guild of Organists' national convention in Washington, D.C.

Mr. Major works actively in the Diocese of Washington's choral festivals held annually for boys, girls, and mixed choirs. He recently founded the American Vocal Ensemble, a professional choral group of sixteen voices, whose repertoire features works of the 16th and 17th centuries as well as contemporary

American music.

Mr. Major received his Bachelor of Music Degree in organ from Webster College, St. Louis, Missouri, where he studied with Dr. Ronald Arnatt. Prior to coming to Washington, he served as associate organist and choirmaster at Christ Church Cathedral in St. Louis.

He is an Associate of the American Guild of Organists and also holds the Choirmaster diploma of the Guild. He received awards for his high scores in each of these examinations.

Mr. Major has recorded two solo organ albums for Gothic Records, featuring the Cathedral's Great Organ with the music of Bach, Tournemire, Reger, and Howells.

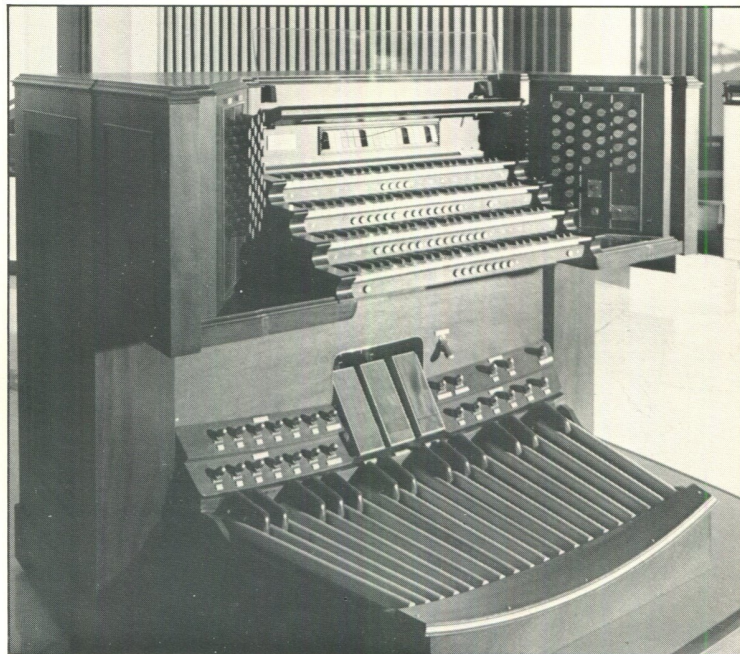
THE FAITH MEMORIAL ORGAN

The Faith Memorial Organ, Opus 11704 of the M.P. Moller Company in Hagerstown, Maryland, represents many months of planning and building. Designed to meet our church's specific musical needs and to complement the Sanctuary's beauty, this pipe organ is a unique creation.

Although the individual stops chosen for this organ come from several different musical eras, the overall tonal concept tends towards the warm, rich French Romantic sound. A vital part of suiting a new organ's sound to its setting is the final voicing, where each pipe is precisely regulated. Mr. Donald Gillett, Tonal Director of the Moller Company, performed this crucial step for the Faith Memorial Organ, voicing each of the 2,749 pipes in its 48 ranks. Preparations have been made in order that 11 additional ranks may be given and installed in the future. Of special aural interest is the Cor de Gabriel, or Gabriel's Horn, a brilliant festival trumpet which will herald special occasions and provide a crown to the full organ ensemble.

The Faith Memorial Organ was also conceived to be visually pleasing, displaying a facade of polished tin and copper. The red mahogany console has four manuals with natural keys of bone and sharp keys of red mahogany. Each stop knob is of red mahogany, with a maple face and stop name in French, indicating the organ's tonal design. The console's many couplers are also of maple, while all remaining metal console appointments are of satin brass. Within the console is a four-memory, solid state combination system, providing an ample number of general and divisional pistons. The console itself is moveable, allowing it to be on display for recitals and concerts. The electrically adjustable bench permits each performer to choose the exact height that best suits him.

The Faith Memorial Organ is a magnificent testimony to the dedication and labor of the congregation, many committees, musicians, and builders. May its noble sound and its physical beauty serve the highest purpose: Praise Ye the Lord!
