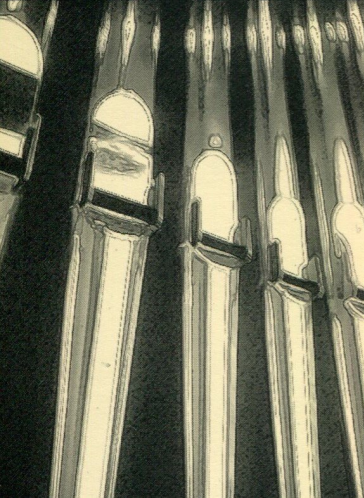
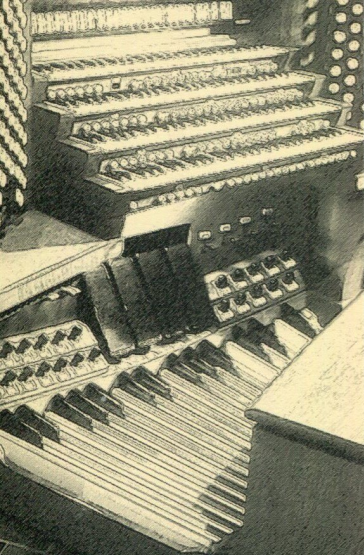

BRADLEY WELCH

Bradley Hunter Welch, a native of Knoxville, Tennessee, received the Bachelor of Music degree magna cum laude from Baylor University, where he studied with Joyce Jones. While at Yale University, completing the Master of Music degree in 1999, and the Artist Diploma in 2000, he was awarded by the faculty the prestigious Horatio Parker Memorial Prize plus three other awards for outstanding artist. As a competitor in the Dallas International Organ Competition in 2000, Welch was awarded the Audience Prize and Third Prize. In May 2001, he received the Musical Arts degree at Yale University, signifying the completion of classwork for the Doctorate in Organ Performance. His teachers were Martin Jean and Thomas Murray. Welch was recently appointed organist of Highland Park Presbyterian Church in Dallas.
