

A carol variation treated in many colorful ways. Listen for these variations throughout the piece as it "echoes" between each of the manuals, using horns and flutes.

Prelude on "God Rest You Merry, Gentlemen"

John Rutter (1945-)

A twentieth century piece written by John Rutter, who is also an outstanding choral composer. You will hear the familiar melody throughout the piece interspersed between manuals and pedal. Over the melody, you may often hear Baroque and Toccatta-like styles. Near the end, listen for the melody in the reeds played in the pedal.

Pastorale on "Gesu Bambino"

Pietro A. Yon (1886-1943)

A 19th century Romantic style piece with conventional harmonies, and a hauntingly beautiful melody played on the oboe stop with string and flute accompaniment.

Jubilation No. 3: Toccata

Dennis Janzer (1954-)

Toccata-like brilliance showing the vastness of the instrument with an interesting rhythmic middle section.
