

MARVELOUS INSTRUMENT

Is The Big Organ At Presby- terian Church

Mr. H. E. Madson, an expert pipe organ tuner, arrived in the city yesterday to finish tuning the Presbyterian organ preliminary to the dedication which is to take place Sunday, December 15. The organ is one of the choicest in Central Ohio, a marvel in beauty of appearance and in sweetness of tone.

The big organ is 41 feet, 9 inches wide, 25 feet, 5 inches high, and 10 feet deep. Its weight exclusive of the electric blower is eight tons. There are in all 1341 pipes, ranging from one half inch to nineteen feet in length, several of the pipes being as much as ten inches square at the base. It has thirty-two stops, besides a set of chimes consisting of twenty tubular bells. The wind for the organ is furnished by a Kinetic blower. It has all the conveniences known to the art of organ building today. Prof. Hermann Ebeling of Columbus says it is a marvelous instrument, one of the best he has ever played, the chimes excelling in richness of melody anything he has ever heard any place.
