

### ORGAN RECITAL NEXT WEEK.

On Wednesday evening next our talented townsman, Roy Falconer, organist of the First Presbyterian church, of Jersey City, will give an organ recital on the new organ of the Ogden Memorial Presbyterian church. He will be assisted by Mrs. Irma Konkle, contralto, and Miss Martha Alexander, violinist, all favorites with Chatham music lovers. The recital affords an opportunity of hearing the capabilities of the new organ, and at the same time enjoying some of the best music ever heard in Chatham.

### New Organ In Use To-Morrow.

The new organ in the Ogden Memorial church is now complete, and will be used for the first time to-morrow morning.

The organ was built by the Tallman Organ Company, of Brooklyn, and contains two manuals of fifty-eight notes each, and pedals with twenty-seven notes.

The organ consists of the following stops, or sets of pipes:

#### GREAT ORGAN.

- 1—8 ft. Open Diapason.
- 2—8 ft. Dulciana.
- 3—8 ft. Melodia.
- 4—4 ft. Principal.
- 5—4 ft. Flute D'Amour.

#### SWELL ORGAN.

- 6—8 ft. Violin Diapason.
- 7—8 ft. Salicional.
- 8—8 ft. Aeoline.
- 9—8 ft. Stopped Diapason.
- 10—4 ft. Flute Harmonic.
- 11—2 ft. Fifteenth.

#### PEDAL ORGAN.

- 12—16 ft. Bourdon.
- 13—16 ft. Gedackt.

#### COUPLERS.

- 14—Swell to Great.
- 15—Swell to Great, octaves.
- 16—Swell to Pedal.
- 17—Great to Pedal.

#### ACCESSORIES.

- 18—Grand Crescendo Pedal.
- 19—Balanced Swell Pedal.
- 20—Bellows Signal.

The organ is perfectly balanced, and when the full organ is on in a crescendo passage displays a large volume of melodious tones. There are a number of effective solo stops.
