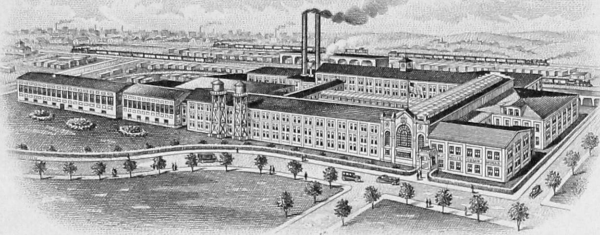
At the present time a budget of \$ 400.00 weekley is raised. Salary of minister \$15.00 weekly.

2,000 loan to pay Miley estate.

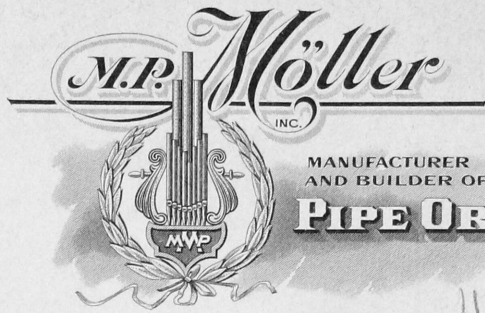
I think the organ account may be liquidated and suggest a full settlement as \$200.00. This matter should be followed with this quotation if agreeable to you.

Promised to pay some amt between June and New Year  
This is the most critical case contacted. There is and has been a  
terrible quarrel among the membership and apparently all the  
potential ones have left. The minister has had a hearing before  
the Pres. of the Synod upon the complaint of its members. A membership  
of 500 has dwindled to about less than 100 who seem to be some  
young persons. I could not contact an official board because I  
surmise there is none. I could not see Mrs. Larsonson because she  
juster said she would be off Jan 1st. Her income is \$15 a wk and does  
the janitor work etc. Own \$300 light, \$3000 in current ante. Mtg about 40,000 in  
closed bank, \$2400 note endorsed by 8 members now off the roll. etc.  
Buy oil for burner not to work. Own and delinquent for oil burner. Rev.  
Wiley is eccentric and seems almost delirious. Dabbles in politics which  
has caused the trouble. Has a terrible brief against M.L.C. It seems that in  
another mo. will see this church closed. The personal side of the situation  
is pathetic. Wiley says was to have received \$200 for selling organ but returned  
\$100 of it to Ford and Reynolds. This case needs close watching and should  
be contract protected.
