## Inside the Bunn-Minnick Pipe Organ Co.

Photographer <u>Dan Trittschuh</u> recently visited a pipe organ operation being run inside an old office building in <u>Harrison West</u> in Columbus' Victorian Village neighborhood. The Bunn-Minnick Pipe Organ Co. was founded in 1969 in Columbus, and these artisans likely have worked on your church's organ at some point.


Dan's trip yielded some beautiful photos of how these stately instruments are constructed and maintained. They can cost up to \$1 million new, and the company creates them as well as restoration. The four-story office building was customized by the company to accommodate the humongous organs – the floor of one room was removed so organs could be set up in the room below.

Bunn-Minnick was founded after Philip Minnick and Robert Bunn Jr. worked at another pipe organ company. "We thought we could do a better job," Minnick said. "They went out of business, and we're still here."




