

# Organist To Perform

Organist George Bozeman, Jr. will be presented in recital Friday at 8:15 p.m. at St. Stephen Methodist Church in Mesquite.

Bozeman, who began his musical studies at the age of six in his home town of Tulia, Tex., has studied also in Amarillo and at North Texas State University. He has held organist posts in Denton at the First Presbyterian Church, Dallas at Park Cities Baptist Church; Albany, Tex., at Matthews Memorial Presbyterian Church, and Breckenridge, First Presbyterian Church. He has given recitals in various churches across Texas.

While in college, Bozeman's interests expanded to include not

only playing organs but also their design and construction. This led to this present position as vice president of Robert L. Sipe, Inc., Organbuilders, the firm who built the organ at Saint Stephen.

Friday's program will feature one unique item in that three transcriptions from Bela Bartok's "Mikrokosmos" will be performed. While this music was originally written for the piano, it can be said that so much of the "Mikrokosmos" is inspired by South-Eastern European bagpipe, flute, and shawm music to such an extent that it often bears a closer relationship to the organ than to the piano.
