

The Bethel Mission Organ.

The new organ just erected in the Bethel Mission Chapel, in Hicks street, by the Messrs. Hook, of Boston, is a fine instrument, and very powerful for one of its size. The plan of its construction is as follows:

GREAT MANUALE.

1. Open diapason, 8 feet, metal, 58 pipes.
2. Dulciana, 8 feet, 46 pipes.
3. Stopped diapason bass, 8 feet, wood, 58 pipes.
4. Melodia, 8 feet, wood, 58 pipes.
5. Octave, 4 feet, metal, 58 pipes.
6. Fifteenth, 2 feet, metal, 58 pipes.
7. Mixture, 2 ranks, 116 pipes.

SWELL MANUALE.

8. Keraulophon, 8 feet, metal, 46 pipes.
9. Stopped diapason bass, 8 feet, wood, 58 pipes.
10. Stopped diapason treble, 8 feet, wood, 58 pipes.
11. Flute harmonique, 4 feet, metal, 58 pipes.
12. Oboe, 8 feet, metal, 58 pipes.
13. Bassoon, 8 feet, metal, 58 pipes.
14. Tremulant.

PEDALE.

15. Sub bass (Bourdon), 16 feet, tone, wood, 27 pipes.

MECHANICAL REGISTERS.

16. Swell to great.
17. Great to pedale.
18. Swell to pedale.
19. Bellows signal, and two combination pedales.
