

GERMAN CHURCH TO BE DEDICATED

SERVICES WILL BE HELD WHEN
IT IS COMPLETED.

Bishop of Omaha Will Conduct Ser-
vices.—Edifice Cost \$20,000.—
August Wendt Is Deco-
rating Interior.

The congregation of the German Methodist church has completed a new house of worship at Lulu and Prince streets at a cost of \$20,000. It is constructed of brick and is of Gothic architecture 67 by 51 feet.

The stewards have employed August Wendt, an ecclesiastical decorator of St. Louis, to decorate the interior and the work is now partly completed. The color of the walls is olive, the ceilings and dome are a creamy white, the whole embellished with lilies and roses, while the woodwork is yellow pine with natural finish.

The church has a basement with cement walls and floor in which Sunday school is conducted and in addition is a kitchen, dining room and rest room.

A Kimball pipe organ, costing \$2,150, is being installed. The instrument has a coupler arrangement to treble the volume of the tone without increasing the touch. It has an adjustment by which combinations can be arranged by the operator before starting selections, the different effects being produced by the slightest touch of the organist during the rendition. Four large pillars surmounted by hand carved capitols provide a setting for the organ.

The church will be dedicated in a few weeks and the audience is at present holding services in the basement awaiting the completion of the auditorium.

Bishop Nuelson of Omaha, Neb., will conduct the dedicatory services.
