Organ History of Emanuel Lutheran Church

The first organ at Emanuel Lutheran Church was presented to the Church in 1918 by the Ladies' Society at a cost of \$3,250. The M. P. Moeller Company of Hagerstown, Maryland, constructed the organ of 16 ranks under the specifications which were prepared by Prof. F. C. Mayer, who was instructor of organ in the Normal School at Woodville, Ohio. The action was Moeller's patent tubular-pneumatic throughout with console detached. The wind for the action and pipes was furnished by a Kinetic Electric Organ Blower. The two-manual console occupied the space to the left of the chancel.

Forty years later the organ was renovated by the Moeller Company, making the action electro-pneumatic. The felts and leathers were replaced and 7 ranks were added. A new three-manual console was located to the right of the chancel. A Choeur organ was added to enhance the sound of the organ going into the wing. This organ was dedicated in 1958.

This Moeller organ has been purchased by Prince of Peace Evangelical Lutheran Church of Medina, Ohio. Removal from our church and rebuilding of the organ is being done by Carl W. Emerson, a pipe organ builder of Cleveland, Ohio.

The organ being dedicated today is Casavant Opus 3688. It has 3 manuals, 34 stops, 50 ranks, and 2,900 pipes which includes the antiphonal organ, placed on the balcony rail. The Deagan chimes from our Moeller organ have been restored and are now a part of this new instrument. The moveable console has been placed to the left of the chancel. Cost of the organ is \$356,820. Renovation of the sanctuary including stripping and refinishing the pews, refinishing woodwork and ceiling, new chancel hardwood floors, interior painting and gold leaf, new aisle carpets, new chancel lighting and a new sound system places the total project at nearly \$500,000.

Organ Committee Background

At the request of our Church Council, an Organ Committee was formed on May 26, 1987. The committee was made up of any persons wishing to serve.

Twenty-one people have taken an active part on this committee, chaired by John Walker. Its purpose was to investigate and interview a variety of organ companies and to present a plan and recommendation to our church council.

This group contained a wide array of people including six organists, two engineers, an architect, educators, business people, etc. So, our search for the right organ for our church was conducted by a well-rounded group, which investigated and surveyed our options with many ideas and a wide expanse of knowledge.

Nineteen organ companies were contacted and fifteen gave us a presentation. This committee traveled at their own expense to tour organ companies and to hear organ recitals and to visit a wide expanse of organs in Ohio; Indiana; Michigan; Pennsylvania; and Quebec, Canada.

The Organ Committee, using a comprehensive evaluation sheet, determined that the Casavant Organ Company would best fulfill our present and future needs of a pipe organ for our church.

The design and building process of our organ has been continuing at Casavant's factory for the past year and a half, where it was built, completely assembled, and voiced. Then it was disassembled, carefully packed, and shipped here. The entire organ has been reassembled, installed in our church, and then revoiced so that each pipe has the correct pitch.

Our church family can be very proud of the quality craftsmanship that has gone into our organ and its superior tonal qualities.

This truly is an instrument that will gloriously praise God for many years to come.
