TRINITY'S PIPE ORGAN

UR new pipe organ completes the "Church of Our Dreams" started many years ago. The original specifications were discarded early in 1941, when the congregation decided to build only the Chapels and Parish House. The contracts for the chapel organs were let to the M. P. Moller Co., Inc., of Hagerstown, Maryland. The pipe organ for the Chapel of Friendly Bells was part of the original specifications, as it was to be the Antiphonal Organ for the Church, also.

Some six months later, in 1942, the congregation decided to go ahead with the rebuilding of the Church. Because of war conditions, it was impossible for any organ concern to build new organs, but they were permitted to rebuild and enlarge old ones. The Diapason Chorus, designed by R. O. Whiteleg of the Moller concern, was purchased and added to the old organ, with the understanding that this Chorus was to be incorporated into the new organ — still a dream to be fulfilled in the future.

Today marks the completion and dedication of the great instrument for which we have waited so long. To the thirteen ranks in the Antiphonal Organ, and seventeen in the Diapason Chorus, have been added sixty ranks of pipes, giving the complete organ ninety ranks of pipes of seventy-three voices, and one hundred and four stops. Stops and intramanual couplers are controlled by drawknobs. Intermanual couplers are controlled by tilting tablets. The four manual console controls organs in six chambers, four in the chancel and two in the rear of the Church. Careful planning in the rebuilding of Trinity has resulted in ideal organ chambers which open from top to bottom directly into the Church.

There are two Diapason Choruses in the Chancel Great, one in the Antiphonal Great, a Reed Chorus in the Swell, and a complete Chorus in the Pedal Organ.
