pared room 12 ft. 6 in. wide and 7 ft. deep
with height varying from 14 ft. to 10 ft.
except over lavatory which is to be 18 ft.
in height. Also additional space above dome
8 ft. wide and 7 ft. deep with height varying
from 8 ft. 6 in. to 4 ft. 6 in. is to be provided.

Aside from a shaft 2 ft. square in one corner, this Organ space is in the clear and unencumbered with pipes or other obstructions.

Perforations for exit of tone are
to be provided over dome, at side of dome, and
in ceiling behind arch in section where console
