#### RECITAL

I. PRELUDE, FUGUE and CHACONNE

Diderik Buxtehude

The Prelude, Fugue and Chaconne is one of Buxtehude's "free" compositions. The fugal form he used was the North German three-part structure. The pedal is used independently, takes full part in the contrapuntal interplay, and frequently stands out in solo passages. In this composition the Chaconne stands in place of the third fugal section.

II. CINQUIEME CONCERTO en Fa majeur George Frederick Handel

Handel composed the concertos for organ and orchestra to be used as Interludes in his oratorios. He was a genius at improvization and seldom wrote out the organ solo part. Handel played on small instruments which would have been incapable of standing up against a strong orchestra. In spite of the light scoring (in three voices only) the organ is mostly used as a solo instrument in contrast with the orchestra.

III. WONDROUS LOVE Samuel Barber

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16. This composition is a set of variations on a shape-note hymn. The authorship of the words and music of this tune are unknown. The words represent the great manisfestation of the love of God for the world. The tune is one of the stirring melodies of the old sacred songs and is yet loved and highly appreciated by the church people in many sections of the country.

IV. JESU, MEINE FREUDE JESU, PRICELESS TREASURE

Johann Gottfried Walther

Walther was a cousin and friend of J. S. Bach. He was a master of the chorale prelude, which he generally treated as chorale variations. This chorale contains 8 variations which are imitative, contain changes of meter, Cantur Firmus treatment (variation 8), and the use of many ornaments in each voice.

"Schmüche dich, o liebe Seele" Deck Thyself, My Soul, With Gladness

Johannes Brahms Opus 122

Brahms wrote the Eleven Chorale Preludes during the last summer of his life. The Preludes are a revealing document of Brahm's thoughts on his own life. This prelude tends to the classic and is indeed close in style and spirit to J. S. Bach. The Preludes were published posthumously in 1902.

VI. FUGUE

Johann Sebastian Bach

This "Little" Fugue in G minor is of small dimension but of serious and moving quality. The subject is similar to a folksong. It is of moderate length but of great beauty and contrapuntal craftsmanship.

VII. "Wachet Auf, ruft uns die Stimme"
Sleepers, wake! A Voice is Calling

Johann Sebastian Bach

This prelude is an arrangement by the composer. In its original form it is found in the Cantata Wachet Auf, as a chorus sung by all the tenor voices, accompanied by strings.

VIII. SUITE BREVE

Jean Langlais

GRAND JEUX

CANTILÈNE

DIALOGUE sur LES MIXTURES

This French composer was born blind. He studied with Dupre and Dukas (composition). In 1945 he became organist at Sainte-Clothilde. He is best known for his organ and church music, though he has composed in other forms. The Suite Breve was first published in 1947.
